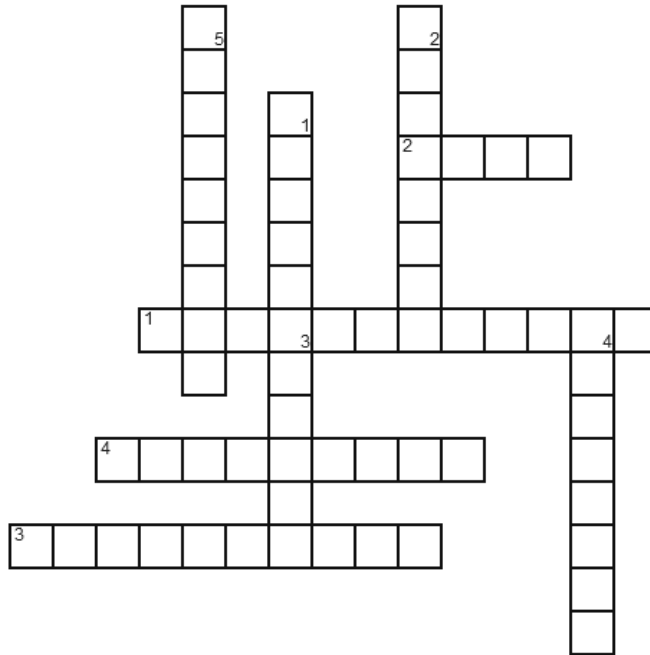




Use the library's *Research In Context* database to complete the crossword puzzle.
