



Utilize this tip sheet to develop best practices to find and utilize Financial Literacy content for your students.


FIND

- To find Financial Literacy lesson plans, navigate to the **Lesson Plans** browse in the banner at the top of the page and utilize the **Subject Area** filter to narrow to **Financial Literacy**.
- When searching, consider focusing on topics like loans, interest rates, or credit to pull reference materials and news/magazine reports.
- Limiting down to statistics can help you pull graphical data for your students to explore.
- Utilize the **Topic Finder** within the **Advanced Search** to narrow a broad topic to more precise results, or find connections to build more diverse lessons.



ORGANIZE

- Create **Folders** within *Gale In Context: For Educators* to house your lesson plans, Gale content, external links, and uploaded files.
- Consider the best way for you to organize. You could organize by grade band, class, unit, or topic.
- Create **Nested Folders** within your established Folders to provide another layer of organization for your colleagues and students.



LEVERAGE

- Collaborate or share content with your colleagues by selecting the **Collaborate** button found within the **My Class Resources** section.
- Share with students by selecting **Send To** and choosing one of the options, including getting a shareable student link, or sending to **Google Classroom**, **Google Drive**, or **Microsoft OneDrive**.
- Your content can support research projects, group discussions, or curriculum development.
