To help prevent learning loss and encourage your child to continue exploring, Gale has created this **A Question a Week** activity utilizing *Gale In Context: Elementary*. This resource (that you get for free at your library) will provide your student with information in many important topics like science, social studies, art, ELA, emotions, health, and more.

Read the directions below and get started!

REQUIRED MATERIALS

- Computer, tablet, or phone with internet access
 - » If you don't have any devices or access to the internet, reach out to your librarian
- *Gale In Context: Elementary*
 - » This is an online resource. Your librarian will be able to show you how to access and provide you with your log in credentials
- Scissors for cutting the questions (if desired)

STEPS

- Chose one consistent day of the week to research your question (like a Monday or Friday)
- Have your child log into *Gale In Context: Elementary*
 - » They can access using a computer, phone, or tablet
- Read the question to your child (or have them read it themselves)
- Allow for time to research and find the answer. Try to stick to under ten minutes
- Have your child share their answer, and provide the correct answer (found on the back of your question card)


