This resource (that you get for free at your library) will provide your student with full access to *National Geographic Kids Magazines*, eBooks, videos, and pictures which bring nature, culture, and history to life.

Read the directions below and get started!

REQUIRED MATERIALS

- Computer, tablet, or phone with internet access
 - » If you don't have any devices or access to the internet, reach out to your librarian
- *Gale Presents: National Geographic Kids*
 - » This is an online resource. Your librarian will be able to show you how to access and provide you with your log in credentials
- Scissors for cutting the questions (if desired)

STEPS

- Chose one consistent day of the week to research your question (like a Monday or Friday)
- Have your child log into *Gale Presents: National Geographic Kids*
 - » They can access using a computer, phone, or tablet
- Read the question to your child (or have them read it themselves)
- Allow for time to research and find the answer. Try to stick to under ten minutes
- Have your child share their answer, and provide the correct answer (found on the back of your question card)



Answer: The Pacific Ocean is the biggest ocean.

Answer: The volcano erupted for 35 years.
