Introduction to the Stoner Collection on Cuban Feminism

The Stoner microfilm collection on Cuban women consists of sixteen rolls of microfilm containing documents gathered in Cuba on the women's movement, 1898-1958. Because Dr. K. Lynn Stoner's own research focused on the Cuban women's movement, 1898-1940, the materials are richest between these dates.

Documents fall into three general categories: 1) Works by feminists about feminists, 2) Works by men about the status of women, and 3) Literary works by feminist writers that discuss the condition of women through the art media. The first group contains memoirs of feminist congresses, collections of essays by feminists, journals published by feminist organizations, and published speeches and radio broadcasts by feminists. In the second category are assessments by politicians, jurists, and legislators about the condition of women. These materials give an impression about what ruling men thought about reforming laws to improve the status of women. The third category contains novels, essays, and poetry written by women about women. Also included are literary anthologies of Cuban women writers in general as well as literary analysis of these women's works.

The collection has a few entries on Vilma Espin, the wife of Raul Castro, who also is a member of the Politburo and the Central Committee of the Cuban Communist Party. She is also the Chairperson of the Federation of Cuban Women. These pieces would make only a small contribution to the study of Vilma Espin.

The Stoner collection lends itself to a study of Cuban women in politics, Cuban feminism, Cuban women's literature and the legal status of Cuban women, 1898-1940. Many of the documents cannot be obtained elsewhere in the U.S. or Latin America.

This guide describes the contents of each of the 13 reels of microfilm in the order in which the material appears on the film. The index is divided into two parts: 1) Authors and 2) Subjects. All references are to page numbers in the guide, which indicates the reel number.

Dr. Stoner filmed these documents in Cuba on two occasions: December 1986 - January 1987 and May 1987 - August 1987, and she has the negatives. Copying for scholarly purposes is permitted provided that acknowledgement is made to this collection as a source.

Modernization implied removing the moral imperatives for punishment of prostitution to viewing it as a threat to public health and hygiene. The book argues for a treatment of prostitution as a social problem, not a moral issue.

Contains rich descriptions of conditions of Cuban prostitution, white slave trade, laws prohibiting prostitution, and laws controlling public health.


This book discusses the causes of prostitution in Cuba and public health issues. It gives a brief history of prostitution in Cuba, the various treatments of prostitution under the law, a discussion of hygiene problems. Valuable accounting of fines and penalties meted out over the late colonial and early republican periods.

This book contains the memoirs of Pablo de la Torriente Brau, some of his correspondence, and a biographical sketch written by Guillermo Martínez Márquez. Pablo de la Torriente Brau was a hero of the Marxist resistance to President Gerardo Machado. His testimonies are about his own experiences, political acts, imprisonment, and the politics of other oppositionists such as the feminists. Dates are between 1930 and 1936.

130. Díaz Rodríguez, Lomberto. Por la moral pública. Havana: Ministerio de Gobernación, 1951.

This is a government report on prostitution in the barrio of Colón, the infamous "tolerance zone" near the wharfs in Havana Harbor. Contains testimonies from politicians as well as police regarding the treatment of prostitutes.
