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General Introduction

These files comprise a small portion of the United States Sanitary Commission Records, 1861-1872 (bulk dates 1861-1865; 765 linear feet) in the Rare Books and Manuscripts Division of The New York Public Library.

Historical Note: The United States Sanitary Commission (USSC), 1861-1865, was a voluntary organization formed to provide medical and physical relief to Union soldiers and officers during the United States Civil War (1861-1865). The USSC modeled its services on women's volunteer organizations such as the women's Central Relief Association (New York), which became a branch of the USSC. Early in the war, these organizations provided local relief to the army; the Commission later expanded this concept throughout the states loyal to the United States government.

The USSC was officially approved on June 9, 1861, by order of Simon Cameron, secretary of war, and endorsed by President Abraham Lincoln. The central headquarters was located in Washington, DC and was also known as the Eastern Department. Branches and societies were eventually formed throughout the country.

Despite the official approval, the USSC was called the "Fifth Wheel to the Coach" by President Lincoln because the government generally believed that major organizations of its kind, such as the Medical Bureau, were already in place. This sentiment was echoed by the Medical Bureau despite the fact that it was a poorly run department unable to handle the needs of a large volunteer army. However, after lengthy negotiations, the USSC was finally approved on the condition that it confine itself to the care of volunteers.

The Commission, as a voluntary organization, did not receive funding from the federal government. Money was raised in various ways and came from a variety of sources. Insurance companies were solicited. Money was raised by women's organizations and through "Sanitary Fairs." Funds were also donated by states loyal to the United States government, including the Pacific states. (On October 14, 1862, California made its first contribution: \$100,000.00.) Money also came from England, Scotland, France, Germany, Belgium, Italy, Russia, Turkey, China, Japan, and the Sandwich Islands (Hawaii), Costa Rica, Chile, Peru, Buenos Aires, Canada, and Cuba.

The USSC continued to minister to veterans after it was officially terminated in July of 1865. Its remaining funds were distributed, and services were offered until the USSC felt that its mission was completed. In the July 1865 session of the Commission a resolution was adopted to cease operations.

Historical Background of the Medical Committee

The Medical Committee appears to have been created to collect and organize all the permanent papers relating to physicians with regard to their observations and treatment of Union soldiers and officers during the Civil War. Many of the documents are dated from 1865 to 1866. Some of these documents are the physicians' final observations about the state of health of the volunteer forces towards the end of the Civil War and shortly thereafter. In this capacity, the Medical Committee became the permanent archive of physicians' reports and letters. The main addressee is Elisha Harris, M.D., Correspondent Secretary of the Commission.

Guides for Access to the Medical Committee Archives

This guide is based on the original index, Volume 26, titled "Guide to the Permanent Papers" with slight variations in text for clarity. The bulk of the documents is numbered from 1 through 1,578. About a third of the documents were at some point removed from the archives, presumably with the permission of the Sanitary Commission and were never received by The New York Public Library. If a document was recorded but not in its assigned location, it was omitted from this guide. Each document received a specific number and was logged into the original index, Volume 26.

Medical Committee Archives

The United States Civil War tested the limited skills of the midnineteenth-century medical community. The standardization of medical training of physicians and surgeons and the rise of the modern hospital would not occur until the twentieth century. Unfortunately, patients suffered more in the hands of incompetent medical care during the Civil War than if they had been left alone.

The initial reports about the volunteers' camps around Washington, DC, (conducted by the United States Sanitary Commission) showed a shocking lack of sanitary management. These camps provided optimum breeding grounds for all types of diseases due to poor sanitary conditions. The Union's regular army troops accustomed to discipline kept their quarters in better condition. At the beginning of the Civil War, the Medical Department of the Union was not prepared to handle massive trauma cases on a large scale. Thomas Lawson, the aging Medical Department head was dying of cancer, and his management style was ineffective at best. It is no surprise that at the start of the war the morale of the medics was so low that over one-third of the surgeons and surgeon assistants left. They joined the Confederates or establish their own private practices. Into this vacuum walked the United States Sanitary Commission, whose objective was to raise the level of medical care among the Union officers and troops.

The Archives may represent the best type of physician and surgeon care available to the Union forces. There is no indication in the records of how many physicians and surgeons volunteered for the Sanitary Commission. Some of the documents indicate that an ongoing professional relationship existed between the Commission and the physicians during and shortly after the Civil War. The bulk of the Archives medical reports and letters on war-related illnesses and injuries such as amputations, diarrhea, fractures, gangrene, gunshot wounds, malaria, mental disorders, and sexually transmitted diseases. Severe diarrhea due to drinking contaminated water is responsible for incapacitating large numbers of soldiers. Gunshot wounds inflicted on every part of the body are prominently reported.

Many reports also include methods of prevention and treatment of illnesses and diseases. A colorful example is a broadside that warns the public against cholera. This broadside is accompanied with a sketch illustrating the procedures to guard against cholera (No. 859). An example of a physician's treatment against disease is S. B. Hunt's report "Control the Sources of Syphilis" (No. 1011). One of the most interesting reports in the Archives is Dr. Charles A. Leale, the army surgeon, who attended Abraham Lincoln after the President was shot at the Ford Theater in Washington, DC. Leale was the first of the attending physicians to give medical care to Lincoln (No. 1232, two different copies). In addition to this report, there are medical reports on different cases by Leale in the Archives.

The Archives does not limit itself only to the reporting of specific diseases and illnesses. A broader view of the health of soldiers and officers can be seen in the reports about field hospitals of the 15th and 16th Army Corps along with reports after campaigns and battles such as the seize of Atlanta in 1864 (Nos. 24 and 453) and the battle of Ezra Chapel in Georgia (No. 23). The latter document is a report of wounds received and operations performed during the Battle of Ezra Chapel in 1864. A dramatic example of incompetent medical care is a report by Dr. Frank Hamilton on persons poisoned from washing rags saturated with pus (No. 1219).

Unintentional humor is also evident in some medical papers such as in the report by R. D. Lyon on bathing parades in the British Navy (No. 63). This document contains a short detailed summary on the hygienic care of sailors in the British Navy. Lyon's also comments upon spurious vaccinations and cooling—that is, the lack of an artificial means to cool rooms down.

It is also possible to get a grasp about medical care in geographic areas such as subtropical New Orleans, Louisiana. The South, with its intense summer heat, presents optimum conditions for all types of opportunistic diseases such as malaria and yellow fever. For example, Dr. George W. Avery based mainly in New Orleans wrote to Dr. Elisha Harris concerning medical conditions in the South. Another physician, Dr. William C. Lyman of the Naval Hospital reported on yellow fever in New Orleans (No. 77). The geographic area of Mississippi is also reported on by Dr. George W. Avery who documented the sanitary management of the United States forces at Ship Island, Mississippi (Nos. 1293 and 1580).

The Archives is also valuable for the reports and letters about African-American troops by physicians. The troops reported upon include the 10th Colored Infantry, the 35th Colored Infantry and the 81st Colored Infantry. Several of these reports were generated by a physician named Ira Russell. One of Russell's report is the classification and tabulation of five hundred autopsies of African-American soldiers (No. 674). Although many of the reports are from Russell, another physician who documented the health of the black troops was Dr. Hemenway who made observations on scurvy and its causes among the United States Colored Troops of the 25th Army Corps during the spring and summer of 1865 (No. 1122).

Documents from and about women are almost lacking in the Archives. There is only one letter of minor consequences from Dorothea Dix, the humanitarian, and a reference to Dix regarding the appointment of female nurses in the Western Department (Nos. 488 and 670, respectively). There is a letter from a woman named Mrs. Leed (No. 583). It is evident that the Commission considered Florence Nightingale to be an important health care person because listed in the original index is a citation for a work titled "The British Army and Miss Nightingale" (No. 383). This item was not received.

Diseases and injuries represent the overwhelming subject content of the Archives. Other subjects are represented to a lesser extent such as Confederates, ambulances, and tents. The Archives contain several documents relating to Confederates including the names of their surgeons and the methods of medical treatment (Nos. 153, 526, 638, 667, 668, and 1484). The subjects ambulances and tents are concerned with how to transport the patient from one location to the other and the manner of providing shelter to the Union forces. One of the documents regarding ambulances and tents is a report from A. B. Crosby,

Division Surgeon in 1862 (No. 1470). Dr. Elisha Harris also felt that it was important to comment about ambulances such as in the work titled "Ambulance: Battle-Field Succor, points agreed upon between Dr. Harris and Dr. Howard" (No. 877). There is also a report on the state of ambulances in Alabama, Arkansas, and Texas by Dr. S. B. Hunt (No. 638).

Artifacts and illustrations are the next type of materials to be considered. There are two small paintings on wood of Fort Clark and the 20th Indiana Volunteers on Cape Hatteras before and after the storm (No. 698). The few illustrations include sketches of mechanical devices and a sketch of a knife used for amputations (Nos. 899 and 972, respectively).

A remarkable picture of nineteenth-century medicine as practiced by physicians and surgeons emerges from the Medical Committee Archives. The heinous conditions of war, compounded with the fact that many of the medical officers never faced large scale injuries and illnesses, meant that many dangerous operations were performed by surgeons with little or no medical skills. This was a time of trial and error, as seen in reports throughout the Archives, even by the best of surgeons. This was also a time for improvisation and invention. There were physicians, lay inventors, accidental or committed, who experimented with different methods to handle illnesses and diseases and to developed tents to house the troops and methods to transport invalids.

The remaining records are miscellaneous medical documents and several bound volumes of pamphlets that are cross referenced in the updated guide.

Camp Inspection Returns, 1861-1864

Historical Background of the Camp Inspection Returns

The inspection of the Union Army volunteers' camps began informally in July of 1861 when two employees of the United States Sanitary Commission, a voluntary civilian organization formed in 1861 to take care of the health of volunteers in the Union Army and Navy during the United States Civil War, examined the camps at Fort Monroe. Their report fueled the worst fears of the Commission that the camps were woefully inadequate. This report prompted Frederick Law Olmsted and Dr. Elijah Harris, officers of the Commission, to examine the twenty camps of volunteers near Washington. They concluded that these camps also lacked proper sanitary facilities. These facts and the thought of having troops ineptly cared for during the war prompted the Commission to devise a systematic inspection of all the volunteer troops. One tangible result of the Commission efforts was the creation of a pamphlet-size document known as a **camp inspection return** which measured 9"x 6" folded, with a series of questions regarding the fitness of the camp, troops and medical facilities, and related topics. As each camp inspection return was sent back to the Commission, a number was assigned to the return.

Guides for Access to Camp Inspection Returns

The **index** provides access to the returns by state. Each state is subdivided by regiment. This same index may be used for access to the **abstract reports** (see page 132).

A numerical/chronological **list of returns** provides basic information about each return. Entries include the number assigned to the camp inspection return, the regiment inspected, military department, location of camp, and the date the inspection was concluded. In order to determine if a specific regiment was examined by the Commission's inspectors, first consult the **index**.

Camp Returns

The original inspection returns, numbering more than fourteen hundred, underwent five known design changes from 1861 to 1864. The returns were numbered 19, 19A, and letters A, C and K. The last form, K, is substantially different from the other returns (see page 76). Returns numbered 19 and 19A comprise the bulk of the returns. The geographic areas covered include Florida, Georgia, Illinois, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, Missouri, North Carolina, Ohio, Pennsylvania, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, West Virginia, and the District of Columbia.

The first type of return, issued in 1861, was **No. 19**. The inspector was a physician or lay person, always male (see, for example, Return #20). This return contained one hundred and seventy-nine questions on a range of subjects beginning with general information such as the name and location of camp, state, military department and date of inspection; other questions looked directly at the environment of the camp. The site of the camp was considered extremely important and the return contained questions concerning the type of soil, subsoil and drainage of the camp. The quality of the tents and the condition of the tents' surroundings were also examined. Questions about the type of blankets, clothing and underclothing of the soldiers detailed further information about the camp facilities and soldiers. The inspector was also prompted by the return to examine the type of food and quality of water readily available. The morale of the soldiers was also studied, particularly the availability of liquor and the amount of intoxication among the troops. Related questions were also asked about the soldiers' morale, noting the availability of entertainment and correspondence with family. Questions were also asked regarding the surgeon on duty and his medical background, noncombatant regimental nurses (male and female) and the care of the sick.

The next type of camp inspection return issued by the Commission was **No. 19A** (for example, see Return #191). This return was an improved version of **No. 19**. This revised return was issued shortly after **No. 19**. The questions were now organized into twenty-one subject areas and the number of questions increased from one hundred and seventy-nine to one hundred and eighty, with several questions expanded into subsections.

The third type of inspection return was **FORM A** (for example, see Return #1226). This return was issued around March 1862. A special note was added to the form dated March 1, 1862, which indicates that the Commission was probably not completely satisfied with the previous reports. The note stated: "Inspectors will be careful to remember that the answers of the Return are expected to present evidence of INVESTIGATION. Except in a few necessary cases, the answers are not intended to be those of the persons whom the inspector examines, but to express his own conviction after due inquiry and reflection."

Form A is the most detailed of the camp returns. Eleven more questions were added to Form A raising the total to one hundred and ninety-one questions from one hundred eighty. Several of the questions underwent extensive expansions. For example, **No. 19A** (question 7) asks for "Name of the commanding officer?" Form A asks in addition if he was educated at West Point and if he had any previous military experience. Form 19A's question 56, under the category PERSONAL CLEANLINESS, asks "Does each man (as a rule) wash his head, neck, and feet once a day?" Return A omits this question but expands the examination of hygiene into five parts.

Two other categories were added to Form A, GENERAL INSPECTIONS and COURT MARTIAL. The court-martial section is particularly interesting because it concerns discipline in the camps and the punishment or fines imposed upon the troops. For example, the return recorded indecent behavior in any place of divine worship and incidence of profane language.

There were two other types of camp inspection returns issued, **Forms C and K**. Both reports were issued around 1863 to 1864. **Form C** (for example, see Return #1235) contains one hundred and eighty questions. Similar in appearance to the other camp inspection returns, Form C differs from Form 19, Form 19A and Form A by consolidating information about camp locations. The result is a more streamlined appearance for the camp inspection return.

Camp inspection return **K** (which did not have the word "form" before the letter K; see Return #1460 for example) was known as the "inspectors' report." It contains only eighteen questions, and was issued late in 1864. Wartime shortage of paper may have accounted for the shortened return. The report has been reduced to basic questions regarding the name of the regiment inspected, the location of the camp and the general condition of the troops. All of the subject categories have been eliminated.

One feature of all of the different types of returns is the blank section for additional remarks. These occasional remarks provided further information about the regiment not easily recorded in the questions. An example is the commentary of inspector Julius Nichols, M.D., regarding the **1st German Rifles** later known as the 8th New York Volunteers. Nichols recorded that this troop from Germany was among the first in service to the United States.* He also remarked on the good health of the soldiers, the respect between soldiers and officers and the excellent discipline of the regiment (see Return #1113). In contrast, another regiment, the 53rd New York Volunteers known as D'Epineuil Zouaves did not fare as well. The inspector remarked that the regiment, consisting of American enlisted men and line officers and French field officers, was very popular in the beginning. But, very soon after they arrived at camp in

Annapolis, the men began to desert their posts. The problems, according to the inspector, escalated due to a number of factors including cultural clashes between the Americans and the French, neglect of the soldiers by the officers, and other related issues (see Return #904). A dramatic example of a near disaster occurred at the camp of the 54th Pennsylvania Volunteers. The inspector reported that an "A tent" at Camp Curtin burning anthracite coal in a California stove had its occupants completely asphyxiated during the night. It was noted that the men were restored to consciousness (see Return #891).

Scattered throughout the returns are reports filed by inspectors reviewing the camps of the African-American troops. The bulk of the reports pertain to the Corps D'Afrique scattered from numbers 1415 to 1444. The camp inspection returns in many instances provide valuable insight about the health of the soldiers, the environment of the camp site and the discipline of the officers and the troops.

Directly related to the original camp inspection returns is a separate section of letters and abstract reports. The letters and agent reports date mainly from 1861. It appears that these letters predate the numbered returns. These agents' reports may be the reports that pushed the Commission to develop the camp inspection returns. The states represented are California, Illinois, Indiana, Maine, Massachusetts, Michigan, New Hampshire, New York, Ohio, Pennsylvania, Virginia and Wisconsin.

Abstract Reports (Box 118) were generated from the camp inspection returns. The report partially covers the camp inspection returns from numbers one to four hundred and fifty. The reports are single elongated pages organized in the same order as the camp inspection returns. The index for the camp inspection returns can also be used for access to the abstract reports. The abstract reports list the regiment and other pertinent information. This information is followed by a list of topics and a number assigned to this topic. For example, next to the word "clean" a number has been assigned, such as 7. An examination of the camp inspection returns along with the abstract reports indicates that 7 was considered excellent on a scale of one to seven, one being the lowest rating.

The last items in this series are the two-volume State Register of Camp Inspections from July to December 1861 and from June 1862 to March 1863. The registers are abstracts of information apparently derived from the camp inspection returns. These registers do not represent all of the states; the states that are represented are grouped according to their geographic location. Next to each state's name is a gross numeric breakdown of data from the camp inspection returns.
