SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The second wave of feminism transformed every aspect of life in the United States. It is rightfully understood as one of the most important social movements of the American twentieth century.

At the fortieth anniversary of the birth of the second wave, Women's Studies scholars are looking back to the origin of their discipline with new eyes. As Barbara Love explains in her introduction to *Feminists Who Changed America* (Urbana: University of Illinois Press, 2006), research is now necessarily reaching beyond the study of well known groups like the National Organization for Women to an exploration of the contributions of the radical, socialist, and lesbian feminists, the local and grassroots organizers, who "made it happen." This microfilm publication, *San Francisco Women's Building/Women's Centers*, 1972-1998, which is Part 2 of *Grassroots Feminist Organizations*, is designed to facilitate this new phase of study. Both indepth community studies and groundbreaking comparative work will be possible due to the access to local primary source materials provided in these publications.

San Francisco Women's Building/Women's Centers, which was acquired by the Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, and Transgender Historical Society in 2001, documents the dedication and passion with which a group of radical feminist and lesbian/feminist activists began to fight in the early 1970s to create a space for both political organizing and community service. Their aim was "to facilitate and participate in the collective strength of women working together for change to a non-oppressive society." They struggled effectively with the tension between their own levels of political consciousness and the needs of the low income women who lived in the neighborhoods surrounding their building, as well as with the difficulties of melding political vision and lack of financial independence. They successfully maintained the first womenowned and women-operated building of its kind in the country—with dozens of women's groups renting spaces and holding events, all the while attempting to adhere to feminist methods and a transparent political process.

The potential for such an organizing center became obvious to the San Francisco women's community during the 1976 International Tribunal on Crimes Against Women, whose participants included the noted feminist writer Andrea Dworkin. The 1976 International Tribunal on Crimes Against Women drew over 1300 participants and initiated the first of a series of annual, internationally-coordinated *Take Back the Night* marches. Within two years, San Francisco activists raised \$150,000 down payment for a building. The original sixteen tenants included the San Francisco referral group Women's Switchboard, Options for Women over Forty, San Francisco Women Against Rape, the Lilith Theater, and the Women's International League for Peace and Freedom. In time, The Women's Building/Women's Centers sponsored well over a hundred projects, including the battered women's shelter La Casa de Las Madres, Al-Muslima, the Action Committee for Abortion Rights (ACAR), the internationalist Alliance Against Women's Oppression, the California Women of Color, the Lavender Hill Women's Retreat, Lesbian Agenda for Action (LAFA), the National Asian Women's Health Organization, the Central America solidarity organization Somos Hermanos,

the working women's group Swingshift, Wages for Housework, Women of All Red Nations (WARN), the Third World Women's Alliance, and many others.

Organizing and educational activity around issues central to second wave feminism in the U.S. are well documented in this collection. These include the broadly supported fights for affirmative action, for reproductive rights, for employment in non-traditional jobs, for non-discriminatory health care, for more enlightened psychiatric community, and for lesbian and gay rights. An awareness of the intersection of race, class, sexual preference, and gender discrimination is evident throughout this collection.

Thanks to the organization's involvement with such a wide range of groups, the Women's Center/Women's Building records are also rich in controversy. Among the contentious issues about which they had to develop policy was the relationship of the space to female police officers, to the explicitly pro-sadomasochism lesbian organization Samois, and to the debates between anti-pornography and anti-censorship feminists.

The activists of the Women's Building also faced more external challenges. An arson attack and a firebombing threatened their attempt keep the doors open in the early years. Winning neighborhood youth to an acceptance of their presence also required effort. Programming had to meet the challenges of both politics and public relations.

One of the richest components of the collection is that which details the culture of the Women's Building and its tenants. Documentation of the music, theater, dance, literature, and the visual arts performances that occurred within its walls, much of which drew upon a newly discovered women's history, is substantive. Important feminist authors such as Audre Lord are presented in their role as mentors for a vibrant activist scene. The MaestraPeace mural group project of decorating the Women's Building can be understood in its historical context.

Overall, researchers will find a wealth of primary source materials that are dated from 1972 to 1998, including notes and minutes from meetings and retreats, correspondence, logs of services provided, annual reports, and commissioned studies, some from the operations of the Women's Building itself, and others from sponsored projects. Proposals, flyers, and budgets from numerous other less official events are included as well. The final decade, 1988 to 1998 was included as a means of comparison and contrast with the years more properly characterized as second wave.

The size and complexity of the San Francisco Women's Centers/Women's Building operations make this an essential collection for the study of second wave feminist and how their ideals were implemented on the grassroots level.

EDITORIAL NOTE

The San Francisco Women's Building/Women's Centers, 1972-1998, collection has been filmed in its original arrangement at the Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, Transgender Historical Society and follows the organization of the Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, and Transgender Historical Society's finding aid. Each of the twelve series and subseries are further broken into parts based on folder titles. These titles are often descriptive and may suggest the nature of the items held within. While the collection comprises materials from 1966 and 1972-2001, due to privacy concerns only materials through 1998 have been microfilmed.

Issues of Privacy and Copyright

Some items judged to violate privacy or copyright were excluded from publication. Those excluded for reasons of privacy include legal documents related to the sale or inspection of the Women's Building, legal documents regarding a dispute with the Dovre Club, financial documents that include the names of large contributors, personnel records that include job applications and evaluations, internal investigations regarding criminal activity, and lists of volunteers who had no expectation of being archived. Home addresses and phone numbers on items bearing a date after 1988 were redacted. In addition, all social security numbers and bank account numbers were masked. When an entire item was deselected due to privacy concerns, every effort was made to insert a Notice of Withdrawal.

The series on the Arts and Crafts Fair initiated by the Women's Building was not included. This series consisted of copyrighted material submitted by artists applying to show their work.

Photographs, Slides, Audiovisual Materials, and Realia

Two series, one consisting of photos and slides and one made up of audiovisual tapes and ephemera, could not be included in a microfilm publication and are available to researchers in the Gay, Lesbian, Bisexual, and Transgender Historical Society reading room.
