



# GENERAL INTRODUCTION

### Planned Parenthood Federation of America Records, 1918-1974

The Planned Parenthood Federation of America (PPFA) is the nation's largest provider of reproductive health care. For more than sixty years it has provided services including birth control, men's sexual health, relationship counseling, sex education, treatment for sexually transmitted disease and international family planning. The PFFA is central to the development of reproductive rights in the 20th century; leading battles to secure and preserve safe, available, and affordable birth control and abortion through public advocacy, education, and lobbying. Its forerunners, the American Birth Control League (1921-1939), the Birth Control Clinical Research Bureau (1923-1939), and the Birth Control Federation of America (1939-1942), worked steadily to improve access to reproductive heath services. The story of reproductive rights in the United States and the activists who gathered broad support for its goals and agenda cannot be told without the records of its central organization.

A detailed history of the PPFA has not yet been written. Though the Federation has been featured in histories of twentieth century birth control, abortion, population control, welfare, and women's rights, the PPFA has never held the spotlight. Access to the Federation's records, especially in the turbulent years 1942 to 1965, offers the historian and policymaker an opportunity to investigate the shifts in the Federation's focus, values and tactics that enabled it to remain at the forefront of a movement undergoing dramatic and fundamental changes.

The records, held by the Sophia Smith Collection at Smith College, is exceptionally strong in its coverage of the legal challenges supported by PPFA and its predecessor organizations, as well as in documenting the relations between PPFA and major stake-holding groups like physicians, social workers, nurses and public health staff. The relationship between local affiliates and the national organization is illuminated both in the collection's coverage of annual meetings and its affiliate files.<sup>2</sup>

On its own this collection chronicles an organization in flux, trying to modernize the debate over birth control, but unable to fully break with its past. In what can be described as its most conservative years, the PPFA tried a new approach to securing the participation of public health leaders and the government. These efforts bore fruit in the mid-1960s, but were ultimately overshadowed by changes wrought by the revival of feminist rationales for contraception and the convenience of the birth control pill.

The PPFA had a good pedigree, born from the merger of the American Birth Control League (ABCL), the national birth control league founded by Margaret Sanger in 1921 and the Birth Control Clinical Research Bureau (BCCRB), which Sanger founded in 1923 as the first legal birth control clinic in the United States. The ABCL worked predominately to build public approval for birth control, support the creation of state and city birth control leagues and clinics, publish the monthly *Birth Control Review*,

and try to change state and federal laws. The ABCL succeeded in attracting the support of middle-class and wealthy women, physicians, patients, and dedicated activists. The BCCRB was a leader in clinical research and testing, advising activists around the country on how to set up and maintain birth control clinics. It also treated thousands of New York City women each year.

The challenge of the Depression both hurt and helped birth control activists as the economic uncertainty swayed more doctors, politicians and the general public to the value of birth control, even as it made funding difficult. The birth control movement fractured in the 1930s when Margaret Sanger split from the ABCL to form the National Committee on Federal Legislation for Birth Control (NCFLBC), to lobby the federal government to revise the 1873 Comstock Act that classified birth control information and devices as obscene and unmailable. In 1937, the NCFLBC secured a U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals ruling, the *U.S. v. One Package*, that granted physicians the right to mail contraceptives. During the 1930s, fierce competition between the ABCL and the BCCRB encouraged the rapid expansion of local leagues and clinics, swelling both the numbers of affiliates and the numbers of women treated.

The rivalry between the ABCL and BCCRB did not end easily, but the duplication of work and limited resources eventually brought the two back together. In 1939, they merged into the Birth Control Federation of America (BCFA). After almost two decades under Sanger's sway, the BCFA sought to capitalize on the movement's popularity to win the support of the medical profession and the government. Their ultimate goal was to provide birth control in every hospital and public health clinic in the country. To achieve it, the BCFA leaders believed they had to remake the movement's public image and its core mission. They believed that success would only come if they downplayed its association with women in favor of a broader emphasis on the married couple. Key to this new vision was a new name, "Planned Parenthood," which would appeal to medical and government men, where "birth control" had not. In 1942, the BCFA was renamed the Planned Parenthood Federation of America, and for the next twenty years, the PPFA, newly staffed with male professionals, adopted an inclusive policy of treating the whole family, not just the mother, offering help with marriage counseling, infertility, and sex education in addition to contraception.

These dramatic changes in PPFA's focus coincided with the United State's entry into World War II, offering PPFA an opportunity to position family planning as pro-American, helping women to join the war effort while their men were at war. When the American birth rate soared after the war, the PPFA encouraged middle and upper class Americans to have larger families, spotlighting infertility research and counseling. They downplayed their past insistence on limiting the numbers of the poor, instead emphasizing how couples could space children and plan prudently for the future. Though PPFA continued to grow during the war years, it was unable to make inroads into public health. The Federation expanded educational efforts, producing pamphlets and other publications aimed at doctors, nurses, clergymen, social workers and government agencies. With the war's end, PPFA aimed to improve maternity care, offering child-spacing, increased medical and religious counseling, and public health initiatives to provide contraceptives to those suffering from venereal disease or tuberculosis.

American families were not the only ones rapidly growing. With the end of World War II, global population expansion combined with widespread food shortages drew attention to the plight of "Third World" nations. Spearheaded by Sanger and British family planning activists, the International Planned Parenthood Federation (IPPF) was created in 1952, a federation of national birth control organizations. Representing the wealthiest nation on earth, PPFA played a pivotal role in the IPPF, supporting its international conferences, sharing its expertise with activists in developing countries, and fostering the creation of national planned parenthood organizations in North and South America through its

membership in the IPPF's Western Hemisphere Region. This new venture was not without conflict as PPFA debated how to divide resources between international and domestic needs.

Among PPFA's priorities, research on fertility and infertility was always on the list, but never a primary goal. Without a large research budget, PPFA partnered briefly with the National Committee on Maternal Health and National Research Council to locate and fund promising scientific efforts. One such project, undertaken by Gregory Pincus and his colleagues at the Worcester Foundation for the Experimental Biology, led to the development of Enovid, the first hormonal contraceptive pill. While not a major funder, PPFA provided seed money for the research, which culminated with the 1960 FDA approval of Enovid, the real first new contraceptive since the birth control movement began. This ushered in a period of change for the Federation.

Easy access to simple and effective contraception revitalized birth control as a feminist issue, even as President Lyndon Johnson's War on Poverty gave the movement a much-needed boost, provided contraceptive education and funding through the Social Security Act, the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, and the U.S. Agency for International Development. In the legal arena the last bastion of the 1873 Comstock Act, Connecticut's draconian law forbidding the *practice* of contraception even among married couples, was struck down by the Supreme Court's 1965 *Griswold v. Connecticut* ruling.

Public interest in and demand for legalized abortion had grown in response to an epidemic of thalidomide-related birth defects as well as increased feminist demands. Under president Dr. Alan F. Guttmacher, the PPFA began studying the question of legalizing abortion, quietly holding a crucial symposium in 1955 to plan out strategies and releasing favorable conclusion in 1959. Another of Guttmacher's initiatives was working more closely with international family planning work. This initiative culminated in 1961 when Planned Parenthood temporarily merged with the fund-raising group, the World Population Emergency Campaign, in order to integrate the work of the two groups. Both of these issues would take on greater significance in the years that followed.

# INTRODUCTION TO PART 1

### Part 1: Planned Parenthood Federation of America, 1916–1966

This collection of the PPFA Administrative Records, (bulk 1942-1965), consists of correspondence, reports, memorandum, minutes, publications, speeches, and press releases documenting the work of the national birth control movement from the 1940s to the early 1960s. This was a transitional period for the Federation, a season of quiet between the flamboyant advocacy of Margaret Sanger and the rebirth of feminism and the sexual revolution of the 1960s. In these years, the PPFA built its identity as a welfare organization aimed at educating medical, government and social agencies while gently pressing for legislative change and government support for contraception. The records are best preserved for the early 1940s, including detailed coverage of the PPFA's annual meetings.<sup>3</sup>

The records document most of the important trends in the history of the birth control movement in the 1940s-1960s. The PPFA was the nation's only major birth control organization and was consulted as an expert by scientists, government agencies, grassroots activists, and medical practitioners, as well as

individuals seeking advice. Its reports and annual meetings provide a snapshot of the state of the birth control movement at various points in the decades, and give a detailed sense of the changes the movement was undergoing.

The records provide a unique insight into a period, which has not received adequate historical study. Of particular interest is the way in which the PPFA operated during World War II and its immediate aftermath—a time when many called for increased fertility from American women. One way to analyze the Federation's tactics is to look to its annual meetings, events staged not only as an opportunity for workers from the affiliates to meet and plan out strategy, but also as the Federation's main public relations event. It was at these meetings that they "pitched" planned parenthood to the American people. What is striking is that in the 1940s, PPFA rarely referred directly to birth control, instead talking in generalities about families and security, titling its annual meetings as "Family Health in America: Problems of the War and Post-War Period" (1943) or "Family Security—A Basis for World Security" (1944), or "The Challenge of Today's Children" (1946).

The records also offer evidence of PPFA's efforts to gain administrative control over the birth control movement, by creating a more hierarchical organization with strict differences between national, state and local activities. PPFA activists hoped to create a movement where they would direct annual campaigns, provide educational and propaganda materials, and deal with other national organizations to encourage support for birth control. The Federation would work with state leagues, which in turn would disseminate the materials produced by the PPFA to county- and city-based affiliates. The new relationship with grass-roots affiliates and state leagues, is documented in the reports created for the annual meetings, as well as in internal memorandums that documented the Federation's plans for work with its affiliates.<sup>2</sup> The work of the Field Committee and the educational workshops PPFA operated in the 1940s provide a good sense of how the PPFA trained workers. A November 1947 "Standards of Affiliation" addresses the Federation's quality requirements from its state and local affiliates. Reels 25 through 29 offer details on the work done by various state organizations, demonstrating PPFA's efforts to expand access to contraceptives through fieldwork, work with specific clinics, public health programs, and hospitals. The bulk of this material covers the late 1930s and 1940s, with far less documentation on such efforts in the 1950s and early 1960s. Not all states are represented, and among those covered in most detail are those dealing with fieldwork in California and Arizona at migrant worker camps, and with New York City's 1957 ban on providing contraception in hospitals.

One of the key differences between the birth control movement of the 1920s and 1930s and the planned parenthood movement of the 1950s and 1960s was a more holistic approach to fertility control that addressed issues such as infertility, marriage counseling and sex education. Directed at both the husband and wife, "planned parenthood" was more about the management of family assets than it was about the health of women and children, the focus in the earlier decades of the movement. The educational literature PPFA created in these decades serves as valuable evidence of these shifting focuses. PPFA's promotional literature broached many topics, including infertility, marriage counseling, birth control access for African-Americans, population, public health and World War II. PPFA's efforts to reach select professional groups using direct mailings provide a fascinating insight into the way the Federation tailored its general message to appeal to groups that varied from home economics teachers to "shapers of public opinion."

One of the strongest themes documented in this microfilm edition is that of birth control legislation. Building on the *U.S. v. One Package* court victory, the PPFA served as a clearinghouse for accurate information on birth control laws in each state, and offered its expertise and advice to states engaged in legal battles. In two states, Connecticut and Massachusetts, where state laws against contraception were unusually strict, the collection contains voluminous reports of meetings, legal proceedings, legislative campaigns, and advice provided by the Federation's attorney, Morris Ernst. Coverage is particularly deep on the 1942 *Tileston v. Ullman, et. al* case, in which Dr. Tileston tested the state law against providing contraceptive information to two women whose medical conditions would be exacerbated by pregnancy. Other important cases covered in the collection include the 1936 *U.S. v. One Package* case, and the Massachusetts campaigns to legalize birth control in the 1940s. A large collection of materials related to the efforts of Sanger's National Committee on Federal Legislation for Birth Control, provides a deep look at that organization's lobbying efforts in the 1930s, including hearings and reports on lobbying.

Another theme represented in the records is the PPFA's efforts to secure support from various professional constituencies, ranging from clergymen to public health officers. PPFA sought to counter Catholic opposition to birth control by securing support from clergymen of other denominations. It's Clergyman's Advisory Committee, set up in the early 1940s, provides evidence of the PPFA's non-confrontational approach to Catholic opposition and its defense of the morality of contraception and family planning through the endorsement of Protestant and Jewish religious leaders. A substantial correspondence with officers of the U.S Public Health Service and local health departments demonstrates PPFA's efforts to secure government support for the provision of contraceptives. While this effort was not immediately successful, by the mid-1960s, the government came around to PPFA's way of thinking. Of particular interest are questionnaires sent by the BCFA to health department officers and to state and local birth control leagues between 1939 and 1942. Less documentation has been preserved here on the PPFA's National Medical Committee and Social Work Advisory Committee, its efforts to secure inroads into these professional groups.

Interest in international birth control and population control was widespread after World War II, and PPFA's pivotal role in the creation of the IPPF and its Western Hemisphere Region are covered, as well as the PPFA's dealings with a number of nations. The documentation is richest on its work with Canada, England, Mexico, and Puerto Rico, as well as other South American, Asian, and Caribbean countries. Some of this material predates the PPFA's creation, going back to Sanger's visits in the 1920s, but the larger portion consists of requests for aid and information, and efforts to found birth control organizations in South America and Asia.

Part 1: Planned Parenthood Federation of America, 1916–1966 is the first step for researchers interested in reproductive rights, women's grass roots organizing, public policy and welfare work, and the legal development of the right to privacy that underlies the rights to contraception and abortion.

# SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

This microfilm publication, *Part 1: Planned Parenthood Federation of America*, 1916–1966, is the first of a three part series of the Planned Parenthood Federation of America Records, 1918-1974. This new series from Primary Source Media is a significant source of information on all aspects of the history of birth control and family planning, including women's health issues; sex education; women in poverty; international population planning and policy; and the legal, political and social aspects of contraception and abortion.

In this current microfilm edition, the bulk of the materials are from 1945-1962 and the records document most of the important trends in the history of the birth control movement during this time period. The administrative records in *Part 1: Planned Parenthood Federation of America*, 1916–1966 include materials regarding:

- **Annual Meetings.** Reels 1-2. Documented here are items regarding the meetings for 1943-1952, 1959, 1966, but the strength are the materials for the 1943-1947 meetings.
- Committees. Reels 2-7. Throughout its history, PPFA has consisted of a variety of distinct departments/committees that included the operating functions of the organization as well as special projects. These documents record the activities of the following: Field Committee (formerly the Regional Organization Committee), Long Range Planning Committee, National Campaign Steering Committee, National Clergymen's Advisory Committee, National Medical Advisory Council, Nominating Committee, Program Committee, Public Information Committee, Committee on Public Progress, Social Research Committee, Social Work Advisory Committee, and Committee to Study State League and Regional Organization. The strength here are the many items representing the work of the National Clergymen's Advisory Committee from 1941-1947.
- Conferences. Reel 7. This small subseries includes materials for the Midwest Regional Conference (1942), a forum about Planned Parenthood in Wartime (1943), a Labor and Planned Parenthood Conference (1947), and workshop conferences and regional staff meetings (1952).
- **General Administration.** Reels 8-9. Variety of documents including by-laws, fundraising records, an organizational history, press releases and various annual and treasurer reports.
- Law and Legislation. Reels 9-15. Arranged by state and Congressional Session (1931-1941), researchers will find much evidence on the struggle in both the state and national arenas to legalize birth control and its instruction, sale, and distribution in all of the United States.
- Literature. Reels 15-18. Researchers can see firsthand a sampling of PPFA published pamphlets and booklets on topics such as infertility, labor, legal aspects, marriage counseling, medical aspects, healthcare for African Americans, population, public health, religious aspects, and World War II.
- Mailings. Reels 18-20. During the 1940s, PPFA spent a great deal of time and money on mass mailings targeted towards groups of professionals. Observe the work towards gaining support from groups such as clergymen, heads of hospitals, home economics teachers, labor leaders, authors, screen writers, editors, columinists, commentators, social workers, physicians, nurses, professors at medical schools, pharmacists, and public health officials.

• Policies and Programs. Reels 20-29. The items on these reels document the effort to work with the U.S. Public Health Program to include contraception as part of the public health program. Track the reports and correspondence with the U.S. Public Health Department, as well as the reports and interviews of the PPFA field workers who spent time in individual states to accomplish this same goal. 25 states are represented in these state files, with particular emphasis towards the rural poor in the south as well as to the migrant worker camps in the western states. The international folders are arranged by country and include materials from a variety of organizations in Canada, China, England, India, Japan, Mexico, Poland, Puerto Rico, Peru and Philippine Islands.

Please consult the introductions written by Cathy Moran Hajo (on pages vii-xi on this guide) for historical organizational information, as well as specific highlights of primary source materials that can be found in this current microfilm edition.

# SOURCE AND EDITORIAL NOTE

This material was microfilmed from the PPFA I holdings of the Sophia Smith Collection (SSC) at Smith College in Northampton, Massachusetts. This current microfilm edition is comprised of Series III, which includes boxes 13-48, of the PPFA I Records. Some of the front matter for this index was created using the original SSC finding aid. The materials have been filmed as they are arranged at the Sophia Smith Collection. The documents in this microfilm publication are the best available. Every technical effort has been made to ensure legibility.
