GENERAL INTRODUCTION

Planned Parenthood Federation of America Records, 1918-1974

The Planned Parenthood Federation of America (PPFA) is the nation's largest provider of reproductive health care. For more than sixty years it has provided services including birth control, men's sexual health, relationship counseling, sex education, treatment for sexually transmitted disease and international family planning. The PPFA is central to the development of reproductive rights in the 20th century; leading battles to secure and preserve safe, available, and affordable birth control and abortion through public advocacy, education, and lobbying. Its forerunners, the American Birth Control League (1921-1939), the Birth Control Clinical Research Bureau (1923-1939), and the Birth Control Federation of America (1939-1942), worked steadily to improve access to reproductive health services. The story of reproductive rights in the United States and the activists who gathered broad support for its goals and agenda cannot be told without the records of its central organization.

A detailed history of the PPFA has not yet been written. Though the Federation has been featured in histories of twentieth century birth control, abortion, population control, welfare, and women's rights, the PPFA has never held the spotlight.¹ Access to the Federation's records, especially in the turbulent years 1942 to 1965, offers the historian and policymaker an opportunity to investigate the shifts in the Federation's focus, values and tactics that enabled it to remain at the forefront of a movement undergoing dramatic and fundamental changes.

The records, held by the Sophia Smith Collection at Smith College, is exceptionally strong in its coverage of the legal challenges supported by PPFA and its predecessor organizations, as well as in documenting the relations between PPFA and major stake-holding groups like physicians, social workers, nurses and public health staff. The relationship between local affiliates and the national organization is illuminated both in the collection's coverage of annual meetings and its affiliate files.²

On its own this collection chronicles an organization in flux, trying to modernize the debate over birth control, but unable to fully break with its past. In what can be described as its most conservative years, the PPFA tried a new approach to securing the participation of public health leaders and the government. These efforts bore fruit in the mid-1960s, but were ultimately overshadowed by changes wrought by the revival of feminist rationales for contraception and the convenience of the birth control pill.

The PPFA had a good pedigree, born from the merger of the American Birth Control League (ABCL), the national birth control league founded by Margaret Sanger in 1921 and the Birth Control Clinical Research Bureau (BCCRB), which Sanger founded in 1923 as the first legal birth control clinic in the United States. The ABCL worked predominately to build public approval for birth control, support the creation of state and city birth control leagues and clinics, publish the monthly *Birth Control Review*,

and try to change state and federal laws. The ABCL succeeded in attracting the support of middle-class and wealthy women, physicians, patients, and dedicated activists. The BCCRB was a leader in clinical research and testing, advising activists around the country on how to set up and maintain birth control clinics. It also treated thousands of New York City women each year.

The challenge of the Depression both hurt and helped birth control activists as the economic uncertainty swayed more doctors, politicians and the general public to the value of birth control, even as it made funding difficult. The birth control movement fractured in the 1930s when Margaret Sanger split from the ABCL to form the National Committee on Federal Legislation for Birth Control (NCFLBC), to lobby the federal government to revise the 1873 Comstock Act that classified birth control information and devices as obscene and unmailable. In 1937, the NCFLBC secured a U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals ruling, the *U.S. v. One Package*, that granted physicians the right to mail contraceptives. During the 1930s, fierce competition between the ABCL and the BCCRB encouraged the rapid expansion of local leagues and clinics, swelling both the numbers of affiliates and the numbers of women treated.

The rivalry between the ABCL and BCCRB did not end easily, but the duplication of work and limited resources eventually brought the two back together. In 1939, they merged into the Birth Control Federation of America (BCFA). After almost two decades under Sanger's sway, the BCFA sought to capitalize on the movement's popularity to win the support of the medical profession and the government. Their ultimate goal was to provide birth control in every hospital and public health clinic in the country. To achieve it, the BCFA leaders believed they had to remake the movement's public image and its core mission. They believed that success would only come if they downplayed its association with women in favor of a broader emphasis on the married couple. Key to this new vision was a new name, "Planned Parenthood," which would appeal to medical and government men, where "birth control" had not. In 1942, the BCFA was renamed the Planned Parenthood Federation of America, and for the next twenty years, the PPF, newly staffed with male professionals, adopted an inclusive policy of treating the whole family, not just the mother, offering help with marriage counseling, infertility, and sex education in addition to contraception.

These dramatic changes in PPF's focus coincided with the United State's entry into World War II, offering PPF an opportunity to position family planning as pro-American, helping women to join the war effort while their men were at war. When the American birth rate soared after the war, the PPF encouraged middle and upper class Americans to have larger families, spotlighting infertility research and counseling. They downplayed their past insistence on limiting the numbers of the poor, instead emphasizing how couples could space children and plan prudently for the future. Though PPF continued to grow during the war years, it was unable to make inroads into public health. The Federation expanded educational efforts, producing pamphlets and other publications aimed at doctors, nurses, clergymen, social workers and government agencies. With the war's end, PPF aimed to improve maternity care, offering child-spacing, increased medical and religious counseling, and public health initiatives to provide contraceptives to those suffering from venereal disease or tuberculosis.

American families were not the only ones rapidly growing. With the end of World War II, global population expansion combined with widespread food shortages drew attention to the plight of "Third World" nations. Spearheaded by Sanger and British family planning activists, the International Planned Parenthood Federation (IPPF) was created in 1952, a federation of national birth control organizations. Representing the wealthiest nation on earth, PPF played a pivotal role in the IPPF, supporting its international conferences, sharing its expertise with activists in developing countries, and fostering the creation of national planned parenthood organizations in North and South America through its

membership in the IPPF's Western Hemisphere Region. This new venture was not without conflict as PPFA debated how to divide resources between international and domestic needs.

Among PPFA's priorities, research on fertility and infertility was always on the list, but never a primary goal. Without a large research budget, PPFA partnered briefly with the National Committee on Maternal Health and National Research Council to locate and fund promising scientific efforts. One such project, undertaken by Gregory Pincus and his colleagues at the Worcester Foundation for the Experimental Biology, led to the development of Enovid, the first hormonal contraceptive pill. While not a major funder, PPFA provided seed money for the research, which culminated with the 1960 FDA approval of Enovid, the real first new contraceptive since the birth control movement began. This ushered in a period of change for the Federation.

Easy access to simple and effective contraception revitalized birth control as a feminist issue, even as President Lyndon Johnson's War on Poverty gave the movement a much-needed boost, provided contraceptive education and funding through the Social Security Act, the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, and the U.S. Agency for International Development. In the legal arena the last bastion of the 1873 Comstock Act, Connecticut's draconian law forbidding the *practice* of contraception even among married couples, was struck down by the Supreme Court's 1965 *Griswold v. Connecticut* ruling.

Public interest in and demand for legalized abortion had grown in response to an epidemic of thalidomide-related birth defects as well as increased feminist demands. Under president Dr. Alan F. Guttmacher, the PPFA began studying the question of legalizing abortion, quietly holding a crucial symposium in 1955 to plan out strategies and releasing favorable conclusion in 1959. Another of Guttmacher's initiatives was working more closely with international family planning work. This initiative culminated in 1961 when Planned Parenthood temporarily merged with the fund-raising group, the World Population Emergency Campaign, in order to integrate the work of the two groups. Both of these issues would take on greater significance in the years that followed.

INTRODUCTION TO PART 2

This collection of correspondence and subject files gathered by the Planned Parenthood Federation of America (PPFA) and precursor organizations, the American Birth Control League (ABCL 1921-1939) and the Birth Control Federation of America (BCFA 1939-1942) is organized into three groupings, Correspondence with Government Agencies (Reel 1), Correspondence with Individuals (Reels 1-17), and Subject Files (Reels 17-42). Within each grouping, folders are arranged alphabetically. The chronological focus of Part II is in the 1930s and 1940s, dealing mostly with the ABCL and BCFA.

This collection strongly reflects the birth control movement's priorities in the 1930s and 1940s, as the national leadership sought to forge strong relations with public health departments, government agencies, and the medical profession. The governmental correspondence reveal repeated difficulties in securing cooperation and partnership, whether it be the Children's Bureau's refusal to answer or forward birth control inquiries to the ABCL, or the unwillingness of the Farm Security Administration to admit publicly that they were funding birth control programs for migrant workers as a part of their program. PPFA's arguments for public funding for contraception is also reflected in a series of abstracted articles on maternal health from 1939-1947 that summarize articles on eugenics, infant health and care, infertility, maternal mortality, population, and the welfare of mothers and children (Reel 17 and 18).

Another major emphasis in the late 1930s was the search for newer, cheaper, and more effective contraceptives. The foam powder method, developed in the mid-1930s, was tested under the auspices of the ABCL, Birth Control Clinical Research Bureau (BCCRB), and BCFA in South Carolina, Florida, and other states. The DeVilbiss, Joyce Ely, and Clarence Gamble correspondence provide details of the testing and of clinic development and operations in Florida, efforts to include birth control in public health, and the combative relations between the ABCL/BCFA and Dr. Lydia DeVilbiss, Dr. Clarence Gamble, and Margaret Sanger. For a summary of the work of Joyce Ely, who investigated and reported on DeVilbiss's Florida work with foam powder, see Reel 3:0700.

One of the most significant characteristics of the late 1930s and early 1940s was the changing relationship between PFFA and leading birth control activists. Preferring a more corporate approach to the "one woman movement" founded by Margaret Sanger in the 1920s, the ABCL, BCFA, and PFFA sought to control and organize the spread of the birth control movement, re-orient the movement as a respectable social work organization with connections to the government and medical profession. This effort is illustrated in the correspondence of PFFA officers, such as National Director D. Kenneth Rose and Presidents Alison Pierce Moore and William Vogt, who reduced the participation of lay women activists in favor of male professionals. The correspondence of Mary Lasker, the wealthy board member who funded educational programs and medical research, and provided the PFFA with access to federal government officials demonstrates the kind of new activist that PFFA desired, one who worked through channels and within the organization's committee structures.

This trend can be traced even more clearly in the dealings between the national organization and maverick birth control activists. Correspondence with Margaret Sanger and Clarence Gamble detail the estrangement of each of these accomplished activists as the BCFA and PFFA sought to curb their influence and control their birth control work. Margaret Sanger's disagreements over BCFA and PFFA policy and tactics with officials and board members, and her unwillingness to allow the national movement to use her name without providing financial support for the BCCRB is well documented. The voluminous correspondence of Dr. Clarence J. Gamble, a member of the ABCL Board of Directors and a major philanthropist for the movement, documents the national's efforts to serve as the one source for contraceptive funding, and its desire for philanthropists like Gamble to channel their support through PFFA. For summaries of Gamble's efforts to foster birth control in Florida, Kentucky, North Carolina and Puerto Rico, see his letter to Alison Pierce Moore, April 5, 1937 (Reel 4:0137) and a 1939 outline of his efforts to establish clinics and foster contraceptive use is found on 4:0281. For an April 9, 1938 harshly-worded letter from the chair of the ABCL's National Medical Council demanding Gamble's resignation, see 4:0230.

PPFA's efforts to secure the support of physicians included securing the active participation of medical men to determine policy. Physicians such as Woodbridge Morris, Robert Latou Dickinson, J. Nicholson Eastman, Frederick Holden, Foster Kennedy, Eric Matsner, Claude C. Pierce, and Robert Seibels held important roles with the organization, and served to also legitimize the birth control movement among medical professionals. Their correspondence covers medical issues, such as a variety of contraceptive methods, policies on medical education, on public health, and the work of the PFFA's medical advisory committee. One of the chief focuses was the publication of Woodbridge Morris and Robert L. Dickinson's atlas of contraceptive technique, which PFFA published and distributed to physicians and medical schools as *Techniques of Contraception*. Another key topic was the public health birth control program founded in South Carolina and its implementation.

The PFFA sought to build a strong network of affiliates across the country, and the correspondence details the work of some of these local activists, including Lydia Allen DeVilbiss (Miami, Fla.),

Elizabeth Barstow Long (Memphis, Tenn.), Carol Nash (New York, N.Y.), and [Nora] Nixon (Augusta, Ga.). The DeVilbiss correspondence is particularly rich, describing the conflict over the amount of financial support the national movement should provide to state programs, and also offers another example of how national leaders tried to control an affiliate with a strong local leader. (Reels 1 and 2). Another view of the relationship between the national organization and the local clinic activist can be found in the correspondence of field workers, sent out to aid affiliates in organizing specific cities or states. These include Ruth Topping, Katherine Trent, Margaret Otis and Ethel Peters. Margaret Otis's report, "Personal Conclusions of Field Trip, April 16-29, 1947 (Reel 10:0261) and reports on specific visits, provides a unique look at the importance that local affiliates put on providing birth control services, and their relative lack of interest in offering infertility consultations and marriage counseling, two fields that the national movement emphasized in order to quell opposition to their work.

Subject files make up a large proportion of this collection. Comprised of research materials used by PPFA to track issues of interest, these files contain a variety of materials, including articles, cartoons, newspaper and magazine clippings, pamphlets, and reports created by PPFA and other organizations. There are significant amounts of correspondence in these files, both incoming and outgoing, therefore they ought to be consulted in conjunction with the correspondence series. Some files document general topics and themes, while others deal with specific events, conferences, committees, and organizations.

These files are remarkably rich for a study of the national birth control movement's public face, including material on promotional materials and media work. Public relations efforts can also be studied using the files that document advertising efforts, and those that cover efforts to ban the ABCL and BCFA from participating in public fairs, such as the 1928 Parent's Exposition and the 1939 Golden Gate International Exposition. Documentation on the 1926 Philadelphia Sesquicentennial Exposition and the 1939 World's Fair detail efforts to carefully sculpt the image of birth control (Reel 26:0127). Efforts to create films on birth control topics are documented, specifically the 1939 *Birth of a Baby* (Reel 26:0922), 1940 *Fight for Life*, and efforts to create a documentary film in 1945. Likewise, efforts to promote birth control on the radio, in melodramatic short plays, "Almost Daylight" (Reel 36:0903) and "Freedom from Fear" (36:0947), debates with religious opponents, short informative discussions, and radio polls on birth control. Reels 19-21 contain a rich trove of birth control articles dating from 1921-1953, though focused on the late 1930s and 1940s, including encyclopedia entries, articles, and PPFA's arguments for birth control in wartime. A 1930 survey, done by the public relations firm of John Price Jones, provides a unique snap shot of the BCCRB and NCFLBC at the start of the Great Depression. (29:0835).

Documents describing PPFA's relations with allied organizations such as the American Eugenics Society, the American Medical Association (particularly the Councils that dealt with contraceptives), the National Research Council, and the National Social Welfare Assembly provide a good of the limits to collaboration with medical groups. Files on various birth control conferences, social work conferences and conferences on marriage counseling and sexology detail a worldwide interest in contraceptives and examine PPFA's role as an international leader. These date from the 1922 Fifth Neo-Malthusian Conference to the 1954 World Population Conference, sponsored by the United Nations.

Reels 21-23 contain subject files documenting birth control clinics, their histories, standards, and policies. These records include sample patient forms, correspondence, and administrative files, articles on clinics, the ABCL/PPFA "Manual of Standard Practice," prepared in 1938 and revised in 1944, reports and lists of referral physicians. New Jersey clinics are covered in more depth than others. Files on contraceptive manufacturers such as Clinico, Holland-Rantos, Ortho Products, provide details about the contraceptives employed by PPFA clinics.

The legal status of birth control in the 1930s is covered in depth, both in the correspondence of lobbyists Katharine Houghton Hepburn (mother of the actress) and Hazel Moore, who worked to pass legislation, as well as in the subject files of law firm Greenbaum, Wolff and Ernst, which provide a wealth of information about the status of birth control laws in the United States, efforts to overturn them, and a detailed compilation of the legal situation in each state, circa 1937-1938, gathered for a summary of the laws in the United States.

The realities of Depression-era birth control is documented in files on relief, social work, and in efforts to find a better, cheaper method of birth control. The medical research files 1943-1946 provide details on the efforts to develop spermicidal “foam powder” and other new contraceptives that were less costly than the diaphragm.

Part II provides indispensable records for understanding the work of the ABCL in the mid- to late 1930s, and that of the BCFA (1939-1941) and first five years of the the PPFSA (1942-1947). The history of the organization is enriched by the correspondence and subject files, providing both a human and more well-rounded counterpart to the organizational files. Researchers studying the history of medicine, women and gender, reproductive rights, and public policy, will find these records critical, as will those interested in non-governmental welfare agencies, grass-roots organizing, or relations between medical and lay activists.

SCOPE AND CONTENT NOTE

The records of the Planned Parenthood Federation of America date from 1918 to 1974 and document the work of PPFA and its predecessor organizations, national and international, in the areas of advocacy, medical research, legislative reform, public relations, as well as the work of individual administrators, staff, and affiliated organizations.

Part 2: Correspondence and Subject Files, 1920-1974, is a significant source of information on all aspects of the history of birth control and family planning . This publication includes a rich collection of materials that highlight the work of the birth control movement from the mid-1930s through the mid-late 1940s. The correspondence (reels 1-17) and subject files (reels 17-42) document the organizational history of the Planned Parenthood Federation of America (PPFA); from the American Birth Control League of America (ABCL) in the mid 1930s, the Birth Control Federation of America (BCFA) from 1939-1941, and the first five years of the Planned Parenthood Federation of America (PPFA) from 1942-1947.

Researchers will find materials on many topics, including:

- Attempts to provide birth control services as part of public health programs throughout the country. The national organization spent much time and effort on building relationships with federal government agencies (like the U.S Public Health Service and Farm Security Administration), as well as and state public health departments and medical associations.
- Organizational focus on securing the support of the medical community.
- Continued mission to provide safe, efficient, and cheap birth control methods. Many materials include documents on various commercial contraceptives and their effectiveness, as well as the foam powder method.
- National organization relationships with long time birth control activists.
- State and local chapters, including through field consultants.
- State contraception laws compiled by Greenbaum, Wolff and Ernst.
- Relief services
- Public information and education through fair exhibitions, magazines, newspapers, mass mailings, theatre, radio, films, television.

SOURCE AND EDITORIAL NOTE

This material was microfilmed from the PPFA I holdings of the Sophia Smith Collection (SSC) at Smith College in Northampton, Massachusetts.¹ This current microfilm edition is comprised of Series VI: Correspondence which includes boxes 57-74 and Series VII: Subject Files which includes boxes 75-106, of the PPFA I Records. Some of the front matter for this index was created using the original SSC finding aid. The materials have been filmed as they are arranged at the Sophia Smith Collection. The documents in this microfilm publication are the best available. Every technical effort has been made to ensure legibility.

Primary Source Media recognizes the privacy issues inherent in a collection of this kind, so a redacting policy was formulated with the Planned Parenthood Federation of America to exclude the following items:

- personal names and addresses of financial donors
- patients, clients, and subjects of case studies
- pharmacists who participated in contraceptive questionnaire (form states, “All replies to the following questionnaire will be received in strict confidence”)
- people invited to be on committees who refused to participate (all invitations after 1938)
- subscribers to *The Birth Control Review* and *The Journal of Contraception*
- financial information about individuals after 1938
