INTRODUCTION

The Bureau of Social Hygiene

The Bureau of Social Hygiene was one of the earliest privately funded social science research institutions in the United States. It was established informally in 1911 as a result of the concern of John D. Rockefeller, Jr., who, after serving as foreman of a Special Grand Jury to investigate white slavery in New York City, concluded that a permanent organization was needed to investigate and combat such social problems. The bureau was incorporated in 1913 for "the study, amelioration and prevention of those social conditions, crimes and diseases which adversely affect the well-being of society, with special reference to prostitution and the evils associated therewith." To accomplish its purposes, the bureau was "to promote or engage in research and instruction, to publish reports and to establish, voluntarily aid, employ or co-operate with other public or private agencies. . . ."

The bureau did not have an endowment but was supported primarily by gifts from Mr. Rockefeller, Jr., who was always the main contributor. It spent more than five million dollars over a twenty-five year period. It was both a grant-making and direct operating organization. It maintained a small staff of specialists who were occupied in research and the examination of requests for assistance from public, semipublic, and private agencies. Bureau staff members frequently did all of the work

on a project themselves or actively sought and developed applications in their area of interest.

The general secretary of the bureau was Dr. Katherine Bement Davis, a sociologist, who had been Commissioner of Corrections of New York City and who was later superintendent of the Bedford Hills Reformatory. Until 1928, the bureau's emphasis was on efforts to discover by the scientific methods of the day the root causes of such problems as prostitution, drug addiction, and other social ills. In this early period, the bureau also took an interest in efforts to control vice and therefore supported studies of commercialized prostitution by Dr. Abraham Flexner and police systems in the United States and Europe by Raymond B. Fosdick.

In 1928 the bureau was reorganized and the charter was amended to widen the sphere of activities. Lawrence B. Dunham, a lawyer and criminologist, was appointed director, and the emphasis was changed from the original interest in causes to a pragmatic effort to apply existing knowledge. The emphasis then was on criminology, delinquency, penology, and police and criminal justice administration. The bureau continued, however, to support studies of social maladjustments, family life, sex, and the effects of narcotics.

The bureau stopped making new appropriations in 1934, and by mid-1937 all previous commitments had been fulfilled. When the bureau was dissolved in 1940, its files were placed in the custody of The Rockefeller Foundation. They were opened for research in 1973 and were given to the Rockefeller Archive Center in 1978.

Because of its interest in broad social problems, the bureau's project files contain information on the approach of experts of the period to such subjects as population studies, eugenics, prostitution, venereal disease, vice control, sex education, birth control, homosexuality, criminology, American and European police systems, American and European prison systems, probation and parole, crime statistics, early ballistics and identification research, organized crime, narcotics manufacture and distribution, population, prohibition, alcohol and drug addiction, juvenile delinquency, maternal health, and mental illness. Although the early period is included, most of the files are for the years 1928 to 1935.

Organizations and special studies covered include American Birth Control League, American Social Hygiene Association, American White Cross Association on Drug Addiction, Associates for Government Service, Association of Grand Jurors, British Social Hygiene Council, Brooklyn Continuation School, Canadian Social Hygiene Council, Committee on Traffic in Opium, Crew Study (Detroit), Crime Prevention Bureau, European Police Systems, Harvard Crime Survey, Institute of Criminology, Institute for Juvenile Research, Laboratory of Social Hygiene, League of Nations, Massachusetts Narcotics Survey, Massachusetts State Prison Colony, National Probation Association, National Research Council Committee on Drug Addiction, National Society for Penal Information, New York University Boys' Club Study, Policewoman's Handbook, Social Science Research Council, Uniform Criminal Statistics, and Women's Prison Association.

Correspondents include Abraham Flexner, Raymond B. Fosdick, Felix Frankfurter, Leonard V. Harrison, J. Edgar Hoover, John D. Rockefeller, Jr., John D. Rockefeller 3rd, Franklin D. Roosevelt, Alfred E. Smith, George Wickersham, and Arthur Woods.

File Organization

The Project and Research Files of the Bureau of Social Hygiene are arranged in two series. The first series contains project information as well as general subject information mainly from the 1928 reorganization through 1935. The series is divided into five subseries:

- 1 Narcotics (Boxes 1-6)
- 2 Social Hygiene (Boxes 7-10)
- 3 Juvenile Delinquency (Boxes 11-14)
- 4 Criminology (Boxes 15-37)
- 5 Miscellaneous (Boxes 38-40)

The second series is the file of Leonard V. Harrison, a leading staff member whose speciality was criminology. The earliest material in this series is dated 1913, but most of the papers are dated 1927-1933. This series is divided into five subseries:

- 1 Narcotics (Boxes 1-2)
- 2 European Police Systems (Boxes 3-14)
- 3 Boston-Harvard Survey (Boxes 15-18)
- 4 Criminology (Boxes 19-23)
- 5 Miscellaneous (Boxes 24-25)

Other parts of the collection, which have not been filmed, include financial and administrative material and papers relating to the New York Police Psychopathic Laboratory.

The Rockefeller Archive Center

During the twentieth century, organizations founded and supported by the philanthropies of the Rockefeller family have had a seminal influence on the development of education, science, medicine, social science, agriculture, economics, conservation, and cultural affairs throughout the world. Material relating to these activities, plus the personal papers of family members and other individuals associated with their endeavors, total some 20 million documents to date and comprise an invaluable and irreplaceable reference source for historians and other scholars.

Between 1965 and 1973, representatives of The Rockefeller University, The Rockefeller Foundation, the Rockefeller Brothers Fund, and the Rockefeller family explored the possibility of creating a single scholarly research center based on their combined record collections. Three of these organizations had, by 1970, active archival programs. The family archives were organized in 1954 as part of the office of the Messrs Rockefeller, the Foundation archives were established in 1967, and the University's in 1969.

By 1973 all three archives were open for limited scholarly research, although their principal function was reference service to their parent organizations. In 1974 the Foundation

published a brief guide to the open collections in its custody that included the records of the General Education Board, The Laura Spelman Rockefeller Memorial, the China Medical Board, the Bureau of Social Hygiene, and other smaller organizations founded by the Rockefeller family.

To insure the protection of these unique collections and to assemble them under one roof, the Rockefeller Archive Center, a joint project of the four founding organizations, was opened in 1975. It is a division of The Rockefeller University with a Governing Council that functions under the authority of the Board of Trustees and the President of the University.

As additional materials from the university, the Foundation, and the family have been received and processed, the Archive Center has opened them to qualified scholars. A brief guide to the open collections is available from the Center. Since new collections are constantly being added and opened, the Center invites inquiries from interested scholars regarding additions to the collections.
