INTRODUCTION

The reports of the General Board, United States Forces, European Theater, are perhaps unique in their scope, detail, and insights. After-action and historical reports were regularly prepared by many echelons of command in the U.S. Army during World War II, and they ultimately provided the raw material for the army's pioneering historical program. Although not required by army regulations of the period, most commanders and staff regularly concluded after-action reports with discussions of lessons learned. Army Ground Forces observers reported on operations in every theater, channeling their observations back to the service schools and training commands. Army and army group headquarters produced voluminous series of reports or papers. Most of these efforts were meant to have immediate utility and stressed practical battle lessons helpful to units still in training.

Gen. Dwight D. Eisenhower, Supreme Commander, Allied Expeditionary Forces, and Commander, U.S. Forces, European Theater of Operations (ETO), saw the need for a more analytical and reflective examination of the experiences of the European campaign which army planners could use in developing future policies. He therefore took action to capture the larger lessons of the campaign before the expertise gathered in his headquarters was dispersed forever, while the records were intact and accessible and memories were fresh.

General Eisenhower established the General Board on 17 June 1945 "to prepare a factual analysis of the strategy, tactics and administration employed by the United States forces in the European Theater" and to make recommendations regarding doctrine, organization, and equipment. The Fifteenth Army, reduced

in strength to a housekeeping entity, was used as the administrative vehicle for the board. Gen. Jacob L. Devers was initially appointed president of the board, but when he returned to the United States shortly after its establishment to assume command of Army Ground Forces, Lt. Gen. Leonard T. Gerow took his place. General Gerow, in turn, was transferred to the Command and General Staff College, Fort Leavenworth, Kansas, in October 1945, and Gen. George S. Patton, Jr., assumed the presidency of the Theater General Board. After his death, Maj. Gen. Leven C. Allen served as president until the completion of the project and the inactivation of the Fifteenth Army, on 31 January 1946.

The board tackled its mission with apparent gusto and initiated studies on a wide range of topics. The reports were completed with surprising expedition and submitted in February 1946 to the War Department, which had in the meantime made plans to utilize the board's analyses and recommendations in reexamining military policy and in planning future changes in procedure, doctrine, and organization.

The board completed a total of 131 studies. The record copies of these reports, together with an index and relevant policy documents, may be found in National Archives Record Group 165, Records of the War Department General Staff, Operations Division, P & O 320. There is also material about the work of the board in Record Group 332, Records of the U.S. Forces European Theater, USFET SGS 322. The studies are grouped into categories by staff section (G-1, G-2, G-3, etc.), branch, and arm or service having interest or jurisdiction over the subject matter. A helpful index lists the reports in numerical order, cross-referenced by subject. The studies usually were written by committees of field-grade staff officers in consultation with other staff officers,

commanders, enlisted personnel, and experts as needed. Virtually all the reports include extensive end notes (usually called "bibliographies") that constitute valuable guides into the primary documentation. Lengthy appendices often provide extracts from relevant documents and orders, Tables of Organization (TOE), statistics, charts, and diagrams. If questionnaires were used to gather information for a report, as in Report Number 13, Organization and Operations of the Counter Intelligence Corps in the European Theater of Operations, they are reproduced in the appendices. In other reports the minutes of conferences of commanders held to collect opinions and information are reproduced verbatim.

The reports address a remarkable variety of topics, from the Transportation Corps in the ETO to civil affairs and military government; from trench foot to ammunition supply for the field artillery; from chaplains to psychological warfare; and from air power to motion picture service. A major concern was the effectiveness and utility of organization structures.

The capstone volume, Report Number 1, Strategy of the Campaign in Western Europe 1944-1945, although it includes little or nothing about intelligence, deception, or ULTRA, is still a useful introduction to many of the historical debates surrounding the campaign in Europe, such as narrow versus broad front, Montgomery's role in the breakout from the beachhead, the calculated risk to hold the Ardennes lightly, and the decision not to take Berlin. Stressed repeatedly is the overriding, almost determining, significance of logistical factors in the minds of the staff planners. The footnotes pinpoint important source documents.

Report Number 11 consists of three lengthy volumes on the Women's Army Corps in the ETO. Two of the volumes are compilations of documents and other material. The conclusions and recommendations called for "elimination of the Women's Army Corps and inclusion of women as an integral part of the various branches, arms and services in job categories for which they are best qualified" and for the "elimination of the theory of a separate 'mission' for women in the armed forces of the United States." It was to be over thirty years before this recommendation was implemented.

Reports 15 and 17, and 48, which examine the types of divisions in the postwar army and the organization, equipment, and employment of the infantry, armored, and airborne divisions, are important reading for any understanding of the evolution of the ground forces. For example, the board came down squarely on one side of a long debate that had plagued tank development during the war when it declared that the best antitank weapon was another tank. It called for further study of the application of the German einheit, or task force, principle to the U.S. Army. It reported that the airborne division, as currently organized, could not adequately sustain itself in combat due to insufficient organic firepower, antiarmor capability, and transport; the board nevertheless concluded that the airborne division should be kept in the force structure because no other type of unit was capable of carrying out certain kinds of missions. It also called for "beefing up" its TOE to approximate that of the infantry division and for changes in doctrine to bring it into line with reality. Far from perceiving light forces as a panacea, the board recommended against any further proliferation of specialized divisions; the standard infantry division had proven itself capable of adaptation to missions in any terrain or climate. On the other hand, board members could not accept the fact that the beloved horse was gone forever, and they called for maintenance of one

cavalry division at cadre strength as an experimental and developmental organization. The board made no effort to consider the impact of atomic weapons on ground combat.

Report Number 5 is one of the few readily available sources of information about the activities of the American Red Cross in Europe during World War II. Studies 19 and 20, and 54 through 56, on strategic and tactical air power and the use of light aircraft for reconnaissance and liaison, are useful background documents for any investigation of the army's long struggle to acquire a new air force to replace the one that had slipped from its control during the war.

These studies shed significant light on issues both of continuing historical interest and of concern to military planners and policymakers today. The judgments and opinions are those of senior professional military officers, involved in the events under discussion and intent upon applying the lessons learned in a matter practical and useful to their craft. They were written before the days when lessons learned became simply another requirement, resulting in inflation and trivialization, at a time when the officer corps was remarkable for its literacy and interest in history. Although many of the recommendations made were not followed, some were, and the positions taken were always important in debates over policy and doctrine. To anyone interested in the strategy, tactics, organization, and administration of the European campaign, these reports will be of use. To any analysis of how the World War II experience influenced postwar internal development of the army, they are essential.
