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Biographical Notes

Alexander Pierre Tureaud, 1899-1972

- 1899** February 26, born in New Orleans, Louisiana
- 1925** received the Juris Doctor Degree from Howard University
admitted to the bar of the District of Columbia
- ca. 1925** employed by the United States Department of Justice
- 1926** returned to New Orleans
- 1926-1930** deputy controller of customs in New Orleans
- 1927** joined the New Orleans Branch of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, serving them as an attorney
admitted to the bar of Louisiana
- 1928-1935** organizer and president of the Eighth Ward Civic League
co-organizer and vice president of the New Orleans Federation of Civic Leagues
-
- 1928** as vice president of the New Orleans Federation of Civil Leagues, Tureaud urged blacks to pay their poll tax, register, and vote
- 1931** worked with the committee on the first registration case of A. M. Trudeau
resigned from the Executive Committee of the New Orleans Branch of the NAACP when they dismissed him and some other black lawyers from a registration case and replaced them with whites; led a group of young men who ousted the old guard from office and aimed the organization in the direction of action on civil rights
endorsed by Louisiana Republicans for the office of Assistant United States Attorney for the Eastern District of Louisiana
married Lucille Dejoie
- 1931-1948** aided Rev. Roger Coleman in his efforts to open up the use of the Municipal Auditorium by blacks

- 1932** became the first National Advocate for the Knights of Peter Claver, serving in that post a total of nineteen years
- 1935** co-authored with C. C. Haydel, M.D., *The Negro in Medicine in Louisiana*
- admitted to practice before the United States Supreme Court
- 1940** handled the investigation for the Knights of Peter Claver of the Glapion Affair involving the embezzlement of funds from the Order's National Secretary
- appointed a notary public, the only black to hold such a distinction at that time, by Governor Earl K. Long
- 1941-1943** in *Joseph McKelpin v. Orleans Parish School Board*, Tureaud successfully argued the first teacher salary equalization case in Louisiana
- 1942-1946** fought and won the voter registration suit *Edward Hall v. T. J. Nagel, Registrar of Voters for St. John the Baptist Parish*
- 1942-1948** achieved the equalization of teachers' salaries in Iberville Parish with the suit *Wiley Butler McMillan v. Iberville Parish School Board*

- 1942-1952** in *Rosana Aubert v. Orleans Parish School Board*, Tureaud argued for the equalization of school facilities between the races
- 1943-1948** achieved the equalization of teachers' salaries in Jefferson Parish with the suit *Eula Mae Lee v. Jefferson Parish School Board*
- 1943-1949** achieved the equalization of teachers' salaries in East Baton Rouge Parish with the suit *Malcolm S. LaGarde v. East Baton Rouge Parish School Board*
- 1944** investigated the beating of some black organizers of the NAACP in New Iberia by whites when they tried to gain admittance to a local welding school
- 1945** began handling legal matters for the Louisiana Education Association, a black teachers' organization

- 1945** chairman of the war bond drive
- 1945-1947** represented Viola Johnson, a black woman, in her fight to enter Louisiana State University's Medical School
- 1945-1954** fought for the equalization of school facilities between the races in *Emanuel Westley v. Iberville Parish School Board*
- 1946** led a three-man NAACP team to Minden, Louisiana to investigate the lynching of John C. Jones, a black Army veteran, and supplied the United States Department of Justice with the names of the lynchers
- 1946-1949** president of the NAACP Louisiana Conference of Branches
- 1948** the Louisiana Legislature adopted a minimum salary schedule without discrimination for public school teachers, a direct result of Tureaud's legal actions on behalf of clients seeking equalization to teachers' salaries in various parishes
- 1948-1951** handled a successful salary equalization case in Mississippi, *Gladys Noel Bates v. John C. Batte, President, Jackson Separate School District*
- 1949** became one of the founders of the Orleans Parish Progressive Voters' League
- filed suit to open New Orleans City Park facilities to blacks
- 1949-1952** represented Clayton Guillory in his suit to force the St. Landry Parish School Board to equalize their facilities for blacks
- in *Aaron Howard v. Lincoln Parish School Board*, Tureaud argued for the equalization of school facilities between the races
- 1949-1953** litigated *Ardie Heard v. Ouachita Parish School Board*, a suit aimed at the equalization of school facilities between the races
- 1950** represented the plaintiff in *Daryl Foister v. Board of Supervisors of Louisiana State University*, a suit aimed at desegregating LSU's School of Nursing

- 1951-1954** represented the plaintiff in a suit to desegregate John McNeese State College in Lake Charles
- 1951-1967** successfully fought for the integration of Orleans Parish public schools in *Oliver Bush v. Orleans Parish School Board*
- 1951-1952** served as National Secretary to the Knights of Peter Claver
- 1952-1970** successfully represented the plaintiff in *Lawrence Hall v. St. Helena Parish School Board* a desegregation case
- 1953-1956** represented the plaintiff in the desegregation suit of *Clara Dell Constantine v. Southwestern Louisiana Institute*
- gained admission to LSU for his son in *Alexander Pierre Tureaud Jr. v. Louisiana State university Board of Supervisors*
- 1953-1963** successfully litigated *Priscilla Angel v. Louisiana State Board of Education*, a suit aimed at desegregating the state's trade schools
- 1954** received the Alumni Award from Howard University for distinguished post-graduate achievement in law

- 1954-1955** handled the case of Richard G. Stewart, who sued the Clark Terrace Unit No. 1, a non-profit public housing corporation, when they refused to do business with Stewart after signing a contract because they found out he was black
- 1954-1970** successfully handled an out-of-court settlement of *Clifford E. Davis v. East Baton Rouge Parish School Board*, which integrated the parish public schools
- 1955** honored by the New Orleans Insurance Executives
- 1956-1961** represented the state NAACP in its fight against the state's membership disclosure laws
- 1956-1962** in *Arnease Ludley v. Louisiana State University Board of Supervisors*, Tureaud successfully challenged the state law requiring students to get a certificate of "good moral character" from their high school principals while at the same time prohibiting the principal from signing such a certificate for blacks going to formerly all white schools

- 1957-1959** handled *Guthbert O. Simpkins v. James C. Gardner, Mayor of Shreveport*, which was aimed at ending racial discrimination on public transit
- 1957-1960** represented the Rev. A. L. Davis in his suit to end segregation of New Orleans Public Service transit lines
- 1957-1961** in *Theodore J. Jamison v. Jack Christian, Mayor of Baton Rouge*, Tureaud successfully challenged segregation on public transit in Baton Rouge
- 1957-1962** helped force the integration of a Shreveport trade school in *Samuel Allen v. Louisiana State Board of Education*
- 1958** was an unsuccessful candidate for the United States House of Representatives from the First District of Louisiana
- 1959-1962** won a favorable decision in *Marietta T. Brown v. Sidney L. Gray, Mayor of Lake Charles*, which held that segregation on Lake Charles buses was unconstitutional
- 1959-1963** fought for the desegregation of the restaurant at the New Orleans International Airport in *William R. Adams v. City of New Orleans*
- 1960** honored by the Louis A. Martinet Legal Society
- worked in behalf of the Kennedy-Johnson ticket in Louisiana
- 1960-1961** represented three students, Mary Briscoe, Jannette Hoston, and John Garner, who were arrested as a result of a sit-down demonstration in Baton Rouge
- 1960-1962** participated in *Charles Avery v. Harrison County, Mississippi*, a suit aimed at desecrating the Gulf Coast beaches
- 1961-1969** in *Bryan Poindexter v. Louisiana Financial Assistance Corporation*, Tureaud successfully challenged the state's grant-in-aid program which provided funds for segregated schools
- 1962** represented plaintiffs Dupey H. Anderson and Acie J. Belton in their challenge of racial designation of political candidates on the ballot

- 1962-1965** represented Pearl Burton in her suit which integrated Northwestern State College of Louisiana
- 1962-1967** successfully represented Frank Pania in his suit against the City of New Orleans which was aimed at ending segregation where alcoholic beverages are sold
- represented the plaintiffs in *Hermon Harris v. St. John the Baptist Parish School Board*, which forced the public schools of the parish to integrate
- 1963-1964** won a judgement for his client to desegregate Nicholls State College in *Edward Baker v. Louisiana State Board of Education*
- 1963-1970** handled *Rickey D. Conley v. Lake Charles School Board*, which involved the desegregation of both the students and the faculty in the public schools
- in *James Williams v. Iberville Parish School Board*, Tureaud forced the integration of the Iberville Parish public schools
- 1964** received the Honorary Doctor of Law Degree from Notre Dame Seminary
- co-chairman of the Johnson-Humphrey Statewide Voters' Committee

- had an audience with Pope Paul VI at Castel Gandolfo, Italy
- 1964-1967** successfully litigated *James Henderson v. Iberia Parish School Board*, which resulted in the integration of the parish public schools
- 1964-1970** represented Dorothy Thomas in her suit which forced the integration of the St. Martin Parish public schools
- represented the plaintiffs in *Yvonne Marie Boyd v. Pointe Coupee Parish School Board*, which integrated the parish public schools
- 1964-1971** successfully litigated *Alfreda Trahan v. Lafayette Parish School Board*, an integration case

- 1965** filed suit to end segregation in all school districts in Louisiana at once by enjoining the state Board of Education from distributing state funds to all local school boards who refuse to desegregate
- represented Mary E. Jamieson, a white woman who sought entrance into Grambling University honored by the Frontiers International
- 1965-1967** served as an attorney for the plaintiff in the desegregation suit of *Donald Jarome Thomas v. West Baton Rouge Parish School Board*
- 1965-1968** served as a member of the Louisiana Commission on Human Relations, Rights, and Responsibilities
- 1965-1969** represented the plaintiff Edward Hill in a suit which integrated the Lafourche Parish public schools
- successfully litigated the desegregation case of *Gwen Boudreaux v. St. Mary Parish School Board*
- 1965-1970** successfully litigated *Welton J. Charles v. Ascension Parish School Board*, which integrated the parish public schools
- represented the plaintiff in *Joyce Moore v. Tangipahoa Parish School Board*, a suit which forced the integration of the parish public schools
- 1965-1971** won a decision for the integration of Acadia Parish public schools in *Catherine Batiste v. Acadia Parish School Board*
- forced the integration of Evangeline Parish public schools in *Joann Graham v. Evangeline Parish School Board*
- achieved the integration of Jefferson Davis Parish public schools in *Marcus Gordon v. Jefferson Davis Parish School Board*
- represented the plaintiffs in *John Robertson v. Natchitoches Parish School Board*, a successful desegregation suit
- successfully represented the plaintiffs in the integration suit of *Marilyn Monteilh v. St. Landry Parish School Board*

- 1966-1970** forced the integration of Caddo Parish public schools in *Beryl N. Jones v. Caddo Parish School Board*

- 1968-1971** successfully argued in favor of a unitary school system as part of the integration plan in *Ura B. Lemon v. Bossier Parish School Board*
- 1969** served as president and co-founder of the local Archives of Negro History
- appointed Ad Hoc Judge of Traffic Court by Acting Mayor Moon Landrieu
- 1969-1970** in *Dana Hubbard v. Fred Tannehill, President, Louisiana State Board of Education*, Tureaud forced the state to supply the public schools with textbooks and other materials on Afro-American history
- 1971** inducted into the Order of the Coif at Tulane University
- received the Knights of Peter Claver's highest honor, the Gold Medal Award
- 1972** January 22, died in New Orleans

Introduction

The papers of Alexander Pierre Tureaud occupy 58 rolls of microfilm. Among the largest groups of papers are records of civil rights cases and non-financial reports. Among other papers are financial reports and statements, organizational constitutions and by-laws, bulletins and news releases, contracts, pamphlets, announcements and invitations, clippings, photographs, biographical material, and collected items. The papers usually are arranged chronologically within each category.

The principal correspondents are Thurgood Marshall (238 items, 1936-1961), Louis Israel (231 items, 1932-1940), Daniel E. Byrd (233 items, 1943-1970), Joseph E. Glapion (188 items, 1932-1940), and John H. Clouser (127 items, 1937-1951). Among other important correspondents are Archie W. Arnaud, Beverley V. Baranco, Theodore E. Carrier, Gilbert Faustina, Archie T. Leceane, J. Roland Prejean, George L. Rieras, Norman C. Amaker, Hale Boggs, Norman J. Chacklin, Gloster B. Current, John Doar, A. Laws, Earl K. Long, Constance Baker Motley, James M. Nabrit III, Leslie S. Perry, Jesse N. Stone Jr., William Bennet Turner, Roy Wilkins, Walter White, Charles H. Houston, Leander H. Perez, deLesseps S. Morrison, and Ernest Nathan Morial.

Among the records of civil rights cases are those concerning school desegregation, such as *Catherine Batiste v. Acadia Parish School Board*, *Joann Graham v. Evangeline Parish School Board*, *Lawrence Hall v. St. Helena Parish School Board*, and *Donald Jarome Thomas v. West Baton Rouge Parish School Board*; those concerning teacher salary equalization, such as *Malcolm S. LaCarde v. East Baton Rouge Parish School Board*, *Eula Mae Lee v. Jefferson Parish School Board*, *Wiley Butler McMillan v. Iberville Parish School Board*, and *Joseph McKelpin v. Orleans Parish School Board*; those concerning transportation, such as *Marietta T. Brown v. Sidney L. Grey, Mayor of Lake Charles*, *Theodore J. Jamison v. Jack Christian, Mayor of Baton Rouge*, and *A. L. Davis v. deLesseps S. Morrison, Mayor of New Orleans*; and those concerning public accommodations, such as *William R. Adams v. City of New Orleans*. There are also records of cases concerning the desegregation of state universities, colleges, and trade schools, such as *Samuel Allen v. Louisiana State Board of Education*, *Priscilla Angel v. Louisiana State Board of Education*, *Daryl Foister v. Louisiana State University Board of Supervisors*, and *Alexander Pierre Tureaud, Jr. v. Louisiana State University Board of Supervisors*. Also included are records of *State of Louisiana v. National Association for the Advancement of Colored People*, a suit aimed at destroying the state NAACP through membership disclosure laws and records of *Bryan Poindexter v. Louisiana Financial Assistance Corporation*, which involved state aid to private, racially segregated academies.

Having practiced law in Louisiana for almost half a century, Tureaud led a varied life as reflected in the scope and magnitude of the collection. Following Tureaud's own method of organization, the collection is divided into different series, each one revealing various aspects of the man who was a dominant leader in the civil rights movement in Louisiana. There are eleven series in all. They include papers about the Knights of Peter Claver, other insurance firms, the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, politics, the Louisiana Education Association, civil rights cases in other states, non-civil rights cases and miscellaneous material, collected historical material, and other collected items.

The Knights of Peter Claver, the subject of the first series, is a black Roman Catholic fraternal organization that, among other functions, provides life insurance benefits for its members. Tureaud, a member of Corpus Christi Council No. 60, was elected by the Order as its first National Advocate, serving in the post off and on for nineteen years. He also served as National Secretary from 1953-1954

and was a candidate for Supreme Knight many times. As National Advocate, Tureaud handled the settlement of insurance claims and helped to get the Order certified in several states to issue insurance policies. The Knights of Peter Claver correspondence (1932-1964) consists mostly of letters from the Depression and war years. Though most of the correspondence concerns insurance claims and internal organization, there are a few items within the series that shed light on black social life in Louisiana during the period. For example, in a letter of December 11, 1933, Louis Israel, the Order's Supreme Knight at the time, wrote to Tureaud claiming that some New Deal agencies discriminated against blacks. In his reply, Tureaud maintained that the federal government was doing all it could to insure racial equality within its programs at the time.

In addition to correspondence, other material may be found within the Knights of Peter Claver series. Among these are minutes, such as those of the National Council (1909-1921), which give a clear picture of the early days of the Order; the Supreme Conclave of the Fourth Degree (August 5, 1946, and July 30, 1955); the Board of Directors (1951-1958), which provide a glimpse into decision-making within the Order; the Louisiana State Conference (1955-1963); and the Claver Building Committee (May 8, 1955, and July 3, 1959), which explain the acquisition of the former French Hospital to serve as the Peter Claver Building. Following the minutes are various reports made to the Order. Among these are reports of the National Advocate (1934-1956), which were yearly summaries of Tureaud's activities as the Order's official attorney; the "Report of the Constitution Revision Committee" (July 1937); the "Special Report on Transactions in the Glapion Affair" (August 3, 1940), detailing the circumstances surrounding the embezzlement of Death Benefits (June 27, 1957); and the "Report on a Meeting to Plan and Prepare 'Manifesto on the Social Apostolate in the South' to be Issued by a Select Group of Catholic Leaders" (n.d.).

Following the reports are constitutions of the Ladies Auxiliary and the Junior Knights of Peter Claver; the "Revised Constitution of the National Court of the Junior Daughters of Peter Claver"; the "Compilation of Laws and Amendments Enacted by National Conventions" (1949-1955); the Louisiana State Conference Constitution; resolutions; financial reports and statements, including those of the Ladies Auxiliary (July 1, 1943-June 30, 1944, and June 1, 1945-June 30, 1946); legal documents pertaining to the Order's insurance obligations; copies of *The Claverite* (January 1940; May-June, 1955; May-June, 1956; July-August, 1958; December 1959; March-April 1960; May-June 1960; January-February 1972; March-April 1972); bulletins and press releases; an inventory of the French Hospital at the time of its purchase by the Order; and forms and applications.

The second series in the collection, containing twenty-five folders, concerns Tureaud's involvement in other insurance companies, including the Pyramid Life and Accident Insurance Company, and various legal documents pertaining to the insurance industry.

The third series, which along with the records of the civil rights cases constitutes the heart of the collection, covers Tureaud's forty-four years with the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People. Tureaud served as an attorney for the NAACP and also held other offices in the organization, including the Presidency of the Louisiana Conference of Branches. The correspondence in this series does not contain items from specific cases, because they are found with the cases themselves. The bulk of this correspondence originated in the 1940s and early 1950s and gives a clear picture of the internal workings of the organization, especially within Louisiana. There are also scores of letters concerning individual civil rights violations for which little legal action could be taken. Of particular interest is correspondence concerning the treatment of black soldiers in the South during the Second World War. Tureaud helped to defend Pvt. Leroy McGary, a young black accused of riot and mutiny, and assisted other black soldiers throughout the course of the war.

Non-correspondence items include memoranda of case lists (1942-1970), which reported to attorneys the current status of civil rights cases throughout the country; minutes of meetings, including those of the Southwest Regional Advisory Board (March 12, 1948), the Louisiana Conference (1947-1954), and the Executive Board (1954); and different NAACP reports, such as those of the Southwest Region (1947-1949), the New Orleans Branch (1942-1943 and 1944-1945), and the Louisiana Conference Five Year Plan (1950-1954). There also are reports and reprinted articles on aspects of the civil rights movement and civil liberties. Among those reports are "Attitude of Student Bodies at Tulane and LSU (to Segregation)" (ca. 1947), "Statement of Policy and Objectives: NAACP Civil Rights Committee" (1949), "Cases of Police Brutality Appearing in the *Louisiana Weekly* in New Orleans in 1949," "Eye of the Storm" (May 7, 1960), and "A Study of Some Tangible Inequalities of the New Orleans Public Schools" (1959-1963). Other non-correspondence items include the NAACP Legal Defense and Educational Fund Monthly Reports (1954-1970); the Civil Liberties Docket (1955-1964); speeches and statements, including speeches by Tureaud, Wayne L. Morse, and John Hope Franklin; affidavits on civil rights violations (1943-1964); NAACP News Letters and Releases (1945-1965); financial information; constitutions and by-laws for branches and for the Louisiana State Conference; resolutions of various NAACP conferences and meetings (1948-1952); a petition to the Orleans Parish School Board concerning desegregation (1963); programs (1930-1970); pamphlets; copies of various black magazines, such as *The Civic Leader* (1929-1930), *The Negro American* (July, 1931), and *The Southern Patriot* (May, 1965 and September, 1966); and racist pamphlets that Tureaud collected over the years.

The fourth series reflects Tureaud's involvement in politics throughout the course of his life. He served as co-organizer and vice president of the New Orleans Federation of Civic Leagues, organized and served as president of the Eighth Ward Civic League, and, in 1949, became one of the founders of the Orleans Parish Progressive Voters' League. The correspondence (1944-1967) in this series touches upon Tureaud's activity at the state and national as well as the local level. Also found in this series is material on Pelican State Democratic Club; the "Round Robin" political organization; and the Orleans Parish Progressive Voters' League, including the League's parish, state, and national constitutions, reports, agendas, minutes, and voting lists. At the end of the series are reports on various political activities, such as National Democratic Committee Reports (1956); financial information on the Kennedy-Johnson Voters' League of Louisiana; material about the Johnson-Humphrey Statewide Voters' Committee, for which Tureaud served as co-chairman; and miscellaneous voting lists and sample ballots.

The Louisiana Education Association (LEA), the black teachers' organization, is the topic under which the fifth series is arranged. Tureaud served the Association as its attorney for more than twenty-five years. Correspondence (1943-1971) in this series consists mostly of an exchange of letters between Tureaud and J. K. Haynes, the LEA's Executive Secretary. Most of the reports contained in the series concern subjects of interest to black educators, such as "Trends in the Elimination of Differentials between White and Negro Education" and the "Report of the Committee on Goals and Objective of the Louisiana Education Association." Also included in this series are minutes (1950-1963), financial information, a constitution, incorporation papers, programs, newsletters, pamphlets, and a few copies of *The Journal*, the LEA's monthly publication.

Other Materials is the title of the sixth series within the collection. The correspondence in this series (1925-1972) derives mainly from Tureaud's law practice other than in civil rights cases and his interests as a businessman. There are a few items in the correspondence concerning Tureaud's efforts to become a Louisiana notary public. Aside from the correspondence in this series there are American

Jewish Congress Newsletters (1962-1965); material on the Louisiana Commission on Human Relations, Rights, and Responsibilities, including correspondence (1965-1968), minutes (1965-1967), a constitution, guidelines, and a "Statement on Nature and Purpose" (October 7, 1965); Autocrat Club correspondence and bulletins (1927-1950); reports and reprints of articles concerning the legal profession; files on the Reginald Rouzan Loyalty case; Tureaud family financial information, such as cancelled checks and receipts; and material pertaining to the Bell Petroleum Company.

The largest series in the collection comprises legal documents of cases in Louisiana and related records. The cases are arranged alphabetically by parish. Within each parish they generally are arranged alphabetically by the name of the plaintiff, except where there are related suits. For example, *Clifford E. Davis v. East Baton Rouge Parish School Board* is followed by its countersuit *East Baton Rouge Parish School Board v. Clifford E. Davis*. Although arrangement of the documents within the cases varies, they are generally arranged according to the following order: correspondence, the complaint, the answer, briefs, motions, memoranda, orders, the opinion, and the appeal. Many of the desegregation suits were consolidated with other desegregation suits and share common legal documents such as briefs and motions. An index to the consolidated legal documents, arranged alphabetically by parishes and showing the location of documents that pertain to more than one case, may be found following the shelf list in the register. For example, looking in this index under *Catherine Batiste v. Acadia Parish School Board*, one can see that a Brief of Plaintiffs pertaining to this case can be found within *Alfreda Trahan v. Lafayette Parish School Board* (Roll 30, box 40, folder 2).

The civil rights cases against state institutions, such as *Alexander Pierre Tureaud Jr. v. Louisiana State University Board of Supervisors*, are arranged alphabetically by the name of the plaintiff following the last parish case. The arrangement of legal documents within the state cases follows the same pattern as those of the parish cases.

There are also civil rights cases from other states that were sent to Tureaud in order to keep him abreast of civil rights litigation around the country. They are arranged in the eighth series by state and within each state by the name of the plaintiffs. In most instances, only the title of the case is given. The exceptions to this are two cases in Mississippi, *Gladys Noel Bates v. John C. Batte, President, Jackson Separated School District* and *Derek Jerome Singleton v. Jackson Municipal School District*, in which Tureaud was one of the attorneys of record.

The tenth series consists of historical material that Tureaud collected as co-founder and president of the local Archives of Negro History.
