The Sale Catalogues in Part One cover the period 1846 to 1856. During this period Puttick and Simpson were the pre-eminent auction house for 'Literary Property, Music, and Works of Art', eclipsing rivals Southeby's and Christies.

As an aid to users we have also included Frank Marcham's 1928 typescript index: An Alphabetical List of some of the principal sales of Literary Property, Music and Works of Art conducted by Messrs, Puttick and Simpson...1846 to 1870.

It is hoped that bibliographers and historians of music, art, literature and commerce will all benefit from the ready availability of this collection.
