HARVESTER/PRIMARY SOCIAL SOURCES

Harvester/Primary Social Sources was established by The Harvester Press in 1972. The first collection, Britain and Europe since 1945, was published in 1973. Harvester/PSS seeks to close a major gap in library coverage of the primary materials of current political and social debates, and to make possible the retrospective acquisition of these crucial social documents. It makes available for the first time ever complete bibliographic descriptions of the enormous output of a large number of contemporary British pressure groups, both current and retrospective. Simultaneously it supplies the material in 'packages' comprising silver-halide archivally-permanent microfiche, 4 ins X 6 ins (105mm X 148mm), with a maximum of 98 frames and 35 mm silver-halide archivally-permanent positive microfilm. (These are not alternative formats; some 'packages' are published with part of the material on fiche and part on roll-film). The entire programme is divided into systematically-organised thematic 'packages'. There is a separate index for each.

Harvester/PSS has been created with the close co-operation and assistance of several hundred issuing bodies, groups and publishers. The most thorough and conscientious efforts are made to ensure the integrity and comprehensiveness of coverage of all material published on the subject of each 'package' by the participating groups. We believe that the inception and development of Harvester/PSS is a major breakthrough in publishing, bibliographic control and reference services and that it will have significant educational consequences. Now all libraries and scholars can acquire at modest cost material that no library anywhere in the world can offer its users.

THE LEFT IN BRITAIN - PART FOUR

1979 - 1987 UPDATE

This is the second update of the Harvester/PSS collection, The Left in Britain - Part Four. It comprises an entire run of the journal Peace News 1979 - 1987.

The contents page shows how the material has been divided - for ease of reference we also provide subsidiary targets, bearing the name of the journal and the date of the issues to follow, before the issues of each year.

The Left in Britain is a continuing programme. Each part being updated with fresh material on microfiche and microfilm. Roll-film is numbered throughout the package in the sequence in which it is produced. Thus, these reels are numbered 101-104, whilst the material on them is direct continuation of the 1973 - 1978 material on reels 60 - 61.
