

PUBLISHER'S NOTE

Harvester Microform are making available with this programme a corpus of material of indisputed importance for all scholars of Post-Reformation English and European History.

Until June 1577 Public Record Office Class SP 70 contained all the State Papers Foreign of Queen Elizabeth I. From July 1577 all State Papers Foreign were classified into the countries to which they referred. A 28 volume series of calendars was published, 1861-1950, covering all the State Papers Foreign from 1574 to July 1589.

Between 1964 and 1980 Professor R.B. Wernham issued three magisterial volumes of lists and analyses covering the papers from August 1589 to April 1592.

Until these volumes were published the papers for August 4598 to April 1592 could only be consulted by a personal visit to the Public Record Office.

This situation still exists for all the State
Papers Foreign of Elizabeth I from Ma 1592.

Anyone wishing to work on foreign affairs - so often intricately tied up with domestic policy of the later Elizabeth period can only do so by travelling to London.

Only complete volumes or bundles are filmed and in some cases these included documents outside the period of this microfilm programme.

As a further aid the reader the relevant sections of the Round Room lists have been reproduced at the beginning of each reel.

These were the years of continual warfare in Western Europe in which political rivalries became intertwined fully with ideological and religious divisions. The main concern of the Elizabethan government was to prevent a resurgence of Spanish power in Western Europe.

During this later period the three major conflicts were:

- a) on the sea with spain
- b) in France in order to prevent the triumph of the Catholic League in the Wars of Religion
- c) in the Low Countries where the fate of the Dutch Revolt was still undecided.

Most of the papers are in the form of correspondence from emissaries, local governors and officials in the places concerned. They were addressed primarily (until his death) to Lord Burghley but also to the Queen and to other government officials. Outgoing papers include instructions and commissions as well as letters which are interspersed with anti-government correspondence as well as letters between foreigners.

The papers as a whole illustrate a degree of anxiety similar to that which existed in domestic affairs through the revival of the aristocratic fravtion and the social and economic difficulties of the 1590s.

This new microfilm edition will be a boon to scholars throughout the world, making these uncalendared key documents easily accesssible for the first times.
