PUBLISHER'S NOTE

Harvester Microform is proud to announce a new series in it's publications of the Rare Radical and Labour Periodicals of Great Britain from the Newspaper Library of the British Library at Colindale. Over 50 periodicals from the late nineteenth and early twentieth centuries have been selected, making available an immense variety of periodical literature which was produced by all sections of the British socialist movement.

Contributions include local trades union papers such as <u>straight Left</u>, organs of major political groupings and of smaller pressure bodies, and national illustrated serials such as <u>Workers' Illustrated News</u>, in 1929 the first workers' picture paper. The contributors include some of the most famous voices of the day - George Bernard Shaw, John Burns, Keir Hardie, Tom Mann, Annie Besant and many others. Together, these periodicals provide and indispensable source for the study both of the radical tradition and of the wider aspect of labour and radical publishing.

A list of contents appears at the beginning of each reel giving the full title, dates and issue numbers of each periodical included in the programme. Changes of title and occasional missing issues have also been indicated, both on the contents page and on publisher's note inserted in the appropriate position on film.

As with any collection of material of this age and diversity there is some variation in quality and this is inevitably reflected in the image achieved. Many of the periodicals were produced with an eye to economy and printed on poor quality or even coloured paper. There may also be a small amount of text lost due to torn pages. These original characteristics occasionally present difficulties of image and contrast which stringent test and camera alterations cannot always overcome. We have sought to exercise responsible care in the production of this collection and to meet the standards established by the National Microfilm Association (NMA) and the American National Standards Institute (ANSI).
