LABOUR PARTY PAMPHLETS AND LEAFLETS, 1900 - 1926

This is the second series in the exclusive Harvester Press microform reproduction of the unpublished and published material from the Labour Party archive at Transport House, London. The first series comprises the Minutes of the Labour Representation Committee, 1900-1906, and from then on the National Executive Committee Minutes of the Labour Party. These are being published subject to a 15-year ruling.

The riches, values and indispensability of the Labour Party's pamphlet and leaflet series at Transport House, is well known to scholars of this period and the complete collection is now being published on microfiche. The first section of this second series will cover the early Labour Representation Committee period to 1906, the development of the Labour Party from its resounding successes in the general election of that year, its succession to government in 1924, and the inter-war slump up to the flash-point of the General Strike 50 years ago. This collection of more than one thousand pamphlets and leaflets gives a unique insight into the tense and turbulent years of the growth of the Labour Party up to 1926.

Occasionally pamphlets and leaflets which were not issued by the Labour Party have been included because these form an intrinsic part of the Labour Party collection. Scholars who have used, or who intend to use, the Labour Party library may well have been disappointed by their omission and for the sake of scholarship and completeness we have retained them.

All documents have been numbered with a code indicating the year of issue and a number within each year. Thus 06/21 means that this is the 21st document in the 1906 listing which has been arranged alphabetically. The contents of each fiche are clearly shown on the fiche headers and in this particular case the document reference on the header reads 1906: 06/01 - 06/31. Document 06/21 appears on this fiche and it can be easily traced by following the numerical order of the documents on the fiche. The document reference appears on the top right hand side of the first page of the document. A listing of all the pamphlets and leaflets, divided into the years of issue, has been reproduced on Card 1. The contents of each year is also reproduced at the beginning of each specific year. In due course a complete bibliographic guide to the Pamphlets and Leaflets will be published.

PUBLISHER'S NOTE

The Leaflets and Pamphlets in this collection are often undated and therefore we have used the dates which have been allocated to the documents by the Labour Party Library. Often there is internal evidence indicating clearly the date of issue but in those cases when neither the staff of the Labour Party Library nor internal evidence have been able to offer a firm date we have followed the practice of adding a question mark to the date i.e. 1907?

Attention should be drawn to the nature of some of the original material. This was often produced with an eye to economy and was printed on poor paper. In many cases extremely fragile and brittle documents have been the only copies available and in these cases a photocopy has been taken to avoid unnecessary handling. When bound volumes have been the only source - as opposed to the Subject Files, the Chronological Files, and the Special Collections Files - photocopies have also been taken of the relevant documents. And in some cases the Labour Party Library may only possess a photocopy - often very old - of a particular item. Poor paper tends to brown as time passes and many of the Leaflets have not escaped this hazard which leads to some deterioration of the image. And in those cases when the original typeface was of an exceptionally small typesize the reader is faced with the same difficulty in this microfiche edition as he is when consulting the original document. These original characteristics present difficulties of image and contrast which stringent tests and camera alterations cannot entirely overcome. "Best Copy Available" targets have been inserted where applicable and every effort has been made to minimise these difficulties. We have sought to exercise responsible care in the production of this unique pamphlet collection and to meet the standards established by the National Microform Association (NMA) and the American National Standards Institute (ANSI).
