## PAMPHLETS AND LEAFLETS OF THE BRITISH LIBERAL PARTY

Harvester Press, already well-known for its important microform publications of the archives of the Conservative and Labour Parties, now introduces its first collection from the rich archives of the British Liberal Party.

The Liberal Party was the dominant force in British politics for several periods in the Victorian age - and even when out of office it was led by giants. William Ewart Gladstone, four times Liberal Prime Minister, is, with the exception of Queen Victoria herself, perhaps the best-known Victorian.

This collection comprises the pamphlets and leaflets of the British Liberal Party between 1884 and 1911. During this crucial period in the party's history there were five Liberal Administrations, two of them led by Gladstone. In addition the Earl of Rosebery was Prime Minister in 1894-95, Sir Henry Campbell-Bannerman in 1905-08, and Herbert Asquith between 1908-15.

The material is of surpassing value for the history of the Liberal decline and of the key issues of party policy, including the handling of the Irish crisis. These themes have been the subjects of major historical debate. This pamphlet and leaflet set, brought together in microform for the first time, will fuel and enrich the discussion.

The political, social and intellectual contribution of the Liberal Party continues to attract wide study. And, as Dr. Roy Douglas of the University of Surrey says, "These remarkable publications recapture the flavour of contemporary politics to an astonishing degree." This collection is of unparalleled scope and completeness and will enlarge the holdings of any library in the world.

## PUBLISHER'S NOTE

A complete listing of the documents together with an Author Index appear on cards 1 and 2. All documents on the listing have been numbered with a code indicating the year of issue and the number of each document within the year of issue. Thus 1896/4 means that this is the 4th document in the 1896 listing. The material has been filmed in the order of the listing. The contents of each fiche are clearly shown on the fiche headers, and in this particular case the document's reference on the header reads 1896/1 -- 1896/5. Document 1896/4 appears on this fiche and can be easily traced. The contents of each year is reproduced at the beginning of each specific year. Please note that there are no documents for 1889.

Attention should be drawn to the nature of some of the original material. This was often produced with an eye to economy and printed on poor paper. This has led to some occasional deterioration of image. "Best Copy" targets have been inserted where applicable. When a run of documents has very much the same defect "Best Copy" notices do not appear before each document.

These original characteristics present difficulties of image and contrast which stringent tests and camera alterations cannot entirely overcome. We have sought to exercise responsible care in the production of this pamphlet collection and to meet the standards established by the National Microform Association (NMA) and the American National Standards Institute (ANSI).
