The Underground and Alternative Press in Britain during 1973

That the Underground and Alternative Press continued to develop and flourish during 1973 can be seen in this bibliographical guide to *The Underground and Alternative Press during 1973*. It accompanies the Harvester/PSS microfiche and microfilm collection of material published by participating groups and publishers throughout 1973, and is the first annual supplement to the 'package' *The Underground and Alternative Press in Britain*. The 1973 update includes the publications of 32 groups and 'papers'. This guide to the update gives information about all groups that were included in the original 'package' and current addresses for all which continued during 1973.

Credit is due to John Noyce who has continued to act as Consultative Editor in the compiling of this update, as he did with the original 'package'. His extensive knowledge of the British underground and contacts within it have proved invaluable in creating this unique collection.

PLACE/DATE OF PUBLICATION/AUTHORSHIP

Publication dates are given as in the original imprint, except for undated items. Where the date of publication (or original) has been inferred from reliable internal or external evidence the conventional form has been adopted: n.d., [1973?]. Where no named author is listed the item was issued anonymously. The place of publication is normally the address of the issuing body.

MISSING MATERIAL

We have attempted to give detailed notes on all material known to have been issued by groups included in the index but not amenable to the extensive searches that have been conducted both in the original files of the organisations and in a large number of library enquiries. Where *specific items* are known to be missing we have noted these at the end of the entry for each organisation in the index. We are continuing our efforts to trace these items and would value any location reports. When found they will be included in further annual supplements.

How to use the Index

As with the first collection of Underground and Alternative Press publications this update – which contains material issued during 1973 – is arranged on an easily-used and fully-indexed system. In a matter of moments the index takes you from your need for a particular item to the exact document you require.

The material in this Harvester/PSS 'package' has been reproduced in two sections, one of microfiche and one of 35mm roll-film. The index will show you whether the item you want is reproduced on a microfiche or on roll-film. This is explained below.

How to find an individual item on microfiche

This follows the same principles as in the first collection. The Harvester/PSS unique page number again appears in the top left-hand corner of each page. As before the number on the *first* page of each document is the reference allocated to that particular document. For fiche, this is the reference you will find in the index. Thus an item of 16 pages with page numbers, say 80–95, will be identified by number 80. The number of each group in the 1973 update follows in sequence from the numbering of the material produced by the group in the first 'package'. For example the last page of *Attila* in *The Underground and Alternative Press in Britain* was numbered 545, so the first page of *Attila* in the 1973 update is 546.

To find an individual item on microfiche, consult the index and find the title you want. Each document has been allocated a two-letter code. Before this code is a number, which signifies the package and the year of the update. The number after the two-letter code is the number of the specific document. Each group and newspaper is in alphabetical sequence in the index.

Suppose you want issue number 11 of *Inside Story* which was published in September 1973. In the index this paper is given *The Underground and Alternative Press in Britain* 'package' number 2, the update number (1973) and the two-letter code MF. In the sequence of Harvester/PSS stamping the first page of this issue is numbered 360 and therefore this particular document will look like this:

2(1973) MF 360 issue 11, September 1973

When you have the complete code for the document, find the 'package' in the Harvester/PSS collection. This is easily identified by the colour blue used on all microfiche in this 'package', through the eye-readable name of the 'package' and through the 'package' number 2 which

precedes each code. To identify the year of the update look at the date in brackets next to the 'package' number in this case (1973).

Then locate the group by the two-letter code. Then pick out the fiche on which the document number appears. Several documents are often filmed on one fiche and the fiche reference will read 2(1973) MF 310-405. Your document 2(1973) MF 360 will appear on this fiche. Insert the fiche in the micro-viewer and move the fiche to read the document you want.

How to find an individual item on 35mm roll-film

This also follows the pattern of the first collection. Pages are *not* stamped with a unique Harvester/PSS page number when they appear on roll-film: they are divided into the years of issue and filmed in sequence. Long runs of papers with a page size too large for convenient use in the microfiche format have been filmed on 35mm roll-film.

Consult the index and find the title you want. It will be clearly marked on the right-hand side of the reference if the document appears on roll-film and the number of the reel to which you must refer is given.

Suppose you wish to consult issue number 12 of *Muther Grumble* which appeared in 1973. It will look like this in the index;

2(1973) PS 201-292 issues 10-17, 1973 Reel (2)(1973), 13

2 at the start of the entry is the 'package' reference. This is followed by (1973) which is the year of the update. PS is the two-letter code referring to the specific group. 201-292 is a guide to the page numbers. Issues 10-17 are the issues included. 1973 is the year of publication. Reel (2) (1973), 13 means that in the 'package' coded 2 this is the 1973 update and this is the thirteenth reel. So reel 13 refers to the Harvester/PSS reel on which you will find issue 12 of *Muther Grumble*.

The label on the roll-film box shows the reel number within the 'package'. The contents of the reel are meticulously marked on the label. Full bibliographical details are provided on the film. For ease of retrieval a space occurs between each issue.

When you have the complete code for the document locate the 'package' in the Harvester/PSS collection. Locate the reel you want (which in this case also contains the publications *IT* and *Private Eye*). These have been filmed in alphabetical order. Wind on the micro-viewer until you reach the easily identifiable *Muther Grumble* flasher. This shows that you have reached the publication you want. Then wind on until you find the issue you need.

WHAT THE INDEX CONTAINS

This sets out a full alphabetical list of all groups and papers in the 'package'. The documents issued by each group are then listed chronologically by date of publication under the appropriate group or paper heading. If the document is part of a serial the issue number and exact date of publication is given where possible. (See above for a note on the Place/Date of Publication). The full reference number for each title is given against the

listing. This will lead you immediately to the relevant microfiche, and to the exact frame occupied by the first page of the item you want, *or* to the relevant roll-film. All documents issued by a particular group are listed under the group heading.

1. The first part of the document discusses the importance of maintaining accurate records of all transactions and activities. It emphasizes the need for transparency and accountability in financial reporting.

2. The second part of the document outlines the various methods and techniques used to collect and analyze data. It includes a detailed description of the experimental procedures and the instruments used.

3. The third part of the document presents the results of the study, including a comparison of the different methods and techniques. It also discusses the limitations of the study and the need for further research.

4. The fourth part of the document concludes the study and provides a summary of the findings. It also includes a list of references and a list of figures and tables.
