

## PUBLISHER'S NOTE

Britain's Literary Heritage is making available a wide selection of literary manuscripts from libraries throughout the world. To this we now add an exceptional collection of rare ephemeral literature - the Robert White Collection of Chapbooks from the University Library, Newcastle-upon-Tyne.

The Chapbooks provided news, entertainment and sensation to the poorer classes of England and were a major influence on authors such as Wordsworth, Clare and Scott. They include riddles and jests; tales for moral instruction; fortune tellings; adaptations of popular ballads such as Robin Hood and Jack the Giant Killer; and songs - romantic, light-hearted and scurrilous - such as "Albion, Pride of the Sea", "Britannia's Sons at Sea", and "New Song of the Victory of Lord Nelson at Copenhagen". These display strong nationalist spirit and a loyal attachment to folk heroes of the day.

In addition to the Chapbooks themselves Harvester Microform is providing informative aids to use. On film we are reproducing:-

- (1) A short title catalogue of the Chapbooks in volume order.
- (2) A guide to Chapbooks with Newcastle imprints, by Frances Thomson.
- (3) A guide to Chapbooks with Scottish imprints, by Dr F.W. Ratcliffe.
- (4) A guide to the remaining 228 Chapbooks, not previously listed.

The short title listing is annotated to show the location of full descriptive entries in the Thomson, Ratcliffe or new Harvester listings. 'T' references direct the user to the Thomson listing, 'R' to the Ratcliffe listing, and 'H' to the Harvester listing. The numbers appearing before the titles give the volume number and the item references.

As a further aid to users, the appropriate section of the short title listing appears at the beginning of each reel.

This guide reproduces in full the short title listing and the new Harvester listing providing details of Chapbooks for which descriptive entries have never before appeared in print. Scholars are also referred to existing printed editions of the Thomson and Ratcliffe listings.


