### **GENERAL CORRESPONDENCE AND POLITICAL RECORDS PART 11: THE LABOUR PARTY AND THE SOVIET UNION 1919-1939**

#### **INTRODUCTION**

The Labour Party has always had an uncertain relationship with the Soviet Union, whilst it initially welcomed the Russian Revolution in March 1917, it became less enthusiastic with subsequent developments.

The collections in the Labour Party archives demonstrate this relationship. Whilst the Labour Party and its governments were advocating closer relations with Russia, the recognition of the Soviet government and its admission into the League of Nations, there was grave concern about the activities within the Soviet Union itself and its influences within the Labour Movement.

The Party officials were acquainted with the Mensheviks before the First World War. It was the Menshevik Rafael Abramowitsch who was partly responsible for convening the Socialist International conference in Stockholm in 1917. Arthur Henderson visited Moscow in June 1917, with Will Thorne, to persuade Alexander Kerensky's provisional government to stay in the war. He sent back favourable reports of the situation in Russia at that time (see Archives of the British Labour Party: General Correspondence and Political Records Part 9A, The J.S. Middleton and Arthur Henderson papers, HEN/1/28-32). Henderson went on to the Stockholm conference, which ended when the Bolsheviks came to power.

After the First World War the Labour Party became instrumental in establishing the Labour and Socialist International in firm opposition to the Moscow-run Third International. It was nevertheless opposed to the military intervention either in the Russian Civil War 1919-1920 or the Russo-Polish War of 1920-1921.

#### **The Labour Party International Department Russian Files**

It was Alexander Kerensky himself who deposited some of these papers with the Labour Party (RUS/KER/1-2), he was in touch with the Party's Advisory Committee on International Questions. There are reports from the Russian regions on Bolshevik activity during the Russian Civil War with letters from Mensheviks expressing concern that the military intervention was damaging their chances of regaining government in Russia (RUS/RCW/1-27). This may well have been a major factor in the Labour Party's opposition to the Lloyd George government's policy on Russia.

The Labour Party's opposition to the Bolshevik government's treatment of its opponents was underlined when in 1922 Ramsay MacDonald and Arthur Henderson actively campaigned to get members of the Russian opposition Social Revolutionary Party released. They assisted the Belgian Socialist, Emile Vandervelde, in traveling to Moscow to help in the defence of the Social Revolutionaries at their trial. The papers on this activity (RUS/SRP/1-53) demonstrate the unequivocal attitude of the Labour Party leadership towards the suppression of opposition in the Soviet Union.

#### **The Council of Action Papers**

After the intervention in Russia in 1919, there was grave concern that the British government might declare war on Russia in the Russo-Polish war in 1920. A special Labour conference held in Central Hall, Westminster passed a resolution "to use all the resources at the disposal of Labour to prevent the British nations from being plunged into war and by all means open to them to restore peace to the world". The (Labour and Russia) Council of Action was set up, its first secretaries being Fred Bramley, H. Scott Lindsay and Jim Middleton, the Assistant General Secretary of the Labour Party.

The organisation only lasted from August 1920 until December 1920 and virtually ceased once the threat of Britain going to war on the side of Poland was removed. The papers demonstrate how the grass-roots of the Labour Party effectively organised themselves behind radical causes: the scope of the policies were starting to include direct action on workers' control, unemployment and Ireland. Councils of Action were briefly revived during the General Strike of 1926.

#### **Ancillary Organisations of the Communist International**

The Communist Party of Great Britain was formed in July 1920. Not long afterwards they tried to affiliate to the Labour Party, but their application was refused. This refusal was confirmed at subsequent conferences and rules were endorsed underlining the separation of the two parties. No communist could be a Labour candidate or a Labour

Conference delegate or even a Labour Party member. The Communist Party itself was under instructions from Moscow "to support the Social Democratic Parties in the same way a rope supports a hanged man".

The Labour Party was concerned that these rules may not be enough to prevent the infiltration of Communist policies into the Labour Party programmes. They thought the Communists would use campaigning organisations to pressurise the Labour Party into submitting to their ideology. They took as evidence of these tactics quotes and resolutions from the Communist International itself (ID/CI/1-7).

Under the relentless beady eye of the Labour Party International Secretary, William Gillies, the "Communist Front" organisations were identified and listed. The first list appeared in the Labour Party Annual Report of 1930. In 1934 Gillies wrote a pamphlet called "The *Communist Solar System*" (ID/CI/39), where he described the ways and the means the Communist International set about to follow the directions of Moscow to control the British Labour Movement.

The extent of Gillies' work can be seen in the number of files: 74 in all. The proscribed list continued even when the Labour and Socialist International instructed its members to form united fronts with communists in 1937. It was abolished in 1972.
