

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PUBLISHER'S NOTE

The founding of the Independent Labour Party (I.L.P), by Keir Hardie, John Trevor and Robert Blatchford in Bradford in January 1893, was one of the most important steps taken by the working-class movement in its quest for social and political equality. Keir Hardie and Ramsay MacDonald were instrumental in the founding of the Labour Representation Committee in 1900, which led directly to the creation of the present Labour Party in 1906.

In the 1906 General Election 27 LRC candidates were successful. These included seven I.L.P sponsored candidates and various other I.L.P members.

Until the early 1930s the I.L.P acted as an important and influential affiliate of the official Labour Party. After this point disagreements over policy issues became more pronounced and in 1932 the I.L.P was disaffiliated by the Labour Party Conference. Three years later 17 I.L.P candidates stood against official Labour Party candidates in the General Election and four I.L.P candidates were successful in Glasgow.

After the mid-1930s the I.L.P exercised a decreasing influence on working-class politics. There were occasional electoral triumphs, such as the success of 3 I.L.P candidates in the 1945 post-war General Election, but the death of James Maxton, the Party leader, was a severe blow. However, the Archives of the Independent Labour Party are a most valuable source for the study of British Labour History. An awareness of the I.L.P - its policies, organisation and individuals - is essential to a full understanding of the inception and rise of the Labour Party to displace liberalism - a major phenomenon in modern British political history.

The aim of this guide, like its companion publications in the same series Archives of the British Labour Party 1873-1973: A Detailed Guide to the Microform Collections (ISBN 0 86257 120 0) and Archives of the British Conservative Party 1867-1986: A Detailed Guide to the Microform Collections (ISBN 0 86257 099 9) is to bring together detailed listings and background information for all the microform publications in the programme Archives of the Independent Labour Party.

Research Publications have now published a substantial section of I.L.P Records and Papers including Pamphlets and Leaflets 1893-1975, Minutes and Related Records 1892-1950, The Francis Johnson Correspondence 1888-1950, and Organisational and Regional Records 1856-1955. For a full list of these microform collections please see page 9 of this guide.

No complete understanding of Labour and working-class history is possible without reference to these archives. They provide the researcher with an excellent insight into all areas of I.L.P activity:

- The Pamphlets and Leaflets trace the development of Labour thought from 1893 to 1975 and deal with the central political and social issues of the period: unemployment, trade unions, strike action, labour law, commercialism and child labour, education, poverty, women's suffrage, Parliamentary representation, war, conscription, disarmament, and the nature of a "Labour" party.
- The Minutes and Related Records provide a unique and comprehensive picture of the I.L.P at work. By the mid-1920s, with some 700 branches and 60,000 members, the party was the intellectual power-house of British social thought and an active influence on international affairs. The Branch Records offer information on the I.L.P at local level.
- The Francis Johnson Correspondence covering the years 1888 to 1950 is probably the most important single archive on this period of British Labour politics. Francis Johnson was the I.L.P's corresponding secretary for nearly half a century. The most informative correspondence is that conducted by Keir Hardie, but there are also many important letters between such figures as Ramsay MacDonald, F.W. Jowett, John Penny, and Philip Snowden, and substantial correspondence from abroad and from other working-class activists. There is much detail on the state of the party and its future prospects.
- Organisational and Regional Records brings together important sections of new, never previously published material. This includes papers of individuals, central organisation papers, journals and circulars, parliamentary election addresses, grass-roots campaigning and election papers.

The original records are now with the British Library of Political and Economic Science, London.

The following brief notes give outline details on some of the major figures within the I.L.P:

James Keir Hardie (1856-1915)

James Keir Hardie was born in Lanarkshire in 1856. Britain's first socialist Member of Parliament began work in a Scottish

coal-mine at the age of ten. He learned the art of public speaking through the temperance movement and became the Miners' Union Secretary in 1879. As a committed trade unionist he established the Scottish Parliamentary Labour Party in 1888.

That year Keir Hardie stood as an Independent Labour candidate against the official Liberal candidate in the controversial mid-Lanark by-election.

In 1892 Keir Hardie was elected as an Independent Labour M.P. - for West Ham South. The following year he founded the Independent Labour Party and was its Chairman until 1900. He was again Chairman in 1913-1914 during the "Coming of Age" celebrations of the I.L.P.. In 1900 he played a leading role in the creation of the Labour Representation Committee.

In 1895 he had lost his seat at West Ham, but in 1900 he was re-elected as an M.P. at a by-election at Merthyr-Tydfil. He continued as M.P. for Merthyr-Tydfil until his death in 1915.

Keir Hardie was also the founder and editor of The Miner, 1887, and subsequently of the Labour Leader. He became Chairman of the Parliamentary Labour Party in 1906 and vigorously asserted its independence from the Liberals. He worked unceasingly to strengthen the ties between the party and the trade union movement. A convinced pacifist, Hardie was also a strong supporter of women's rights.

John Bruce Glasier (1859-1920)

Poet, prophet and propagandist, John Bruce Glasier was born in Glasgow in 1859 and attended school at Newton-on-Ayr. As far back as 1879 and 1880 he was advocating Socialism on the platforms of literary, Land League, and Radical Societies in Glasgow. He was one of the founders of the Socialist movement and has been hailed as the "Apostle of Socialism".

In 1883 he was active in the Irish and Highland Land League agitations. He became a member of the Socialist League in 1885 and was a delegate from Govan to the 1894 Conference of the I.L.P. He was elected to the National Council in 1897 and served almost continuously on the NAC.

He married Katherine St. John Conway and together they devoted themselves to the party effort. From 1900 to 1903, John Bruce Glasier succeeded Keir Hardie as Chairman of the I.L.P. For 4½ years he was Editor of "Labour Leader". On Glasier's retirement from the editorship in 1909 Keir Hardie wrote of his colleague: "The I.L.P. and the Labour Party owe more to him than they can possibly know. Not a little of the credit for the consolidation of the forces, and the infusion of the Socialist spirit into the

ranks of organised Labour, which have been such marked features of the movement during the past few years, rightfully belongs to him. His literary gifts, his wide knowledge of literature and of the best thought of the great minds of all ages of the world's history; his familiarity with poetry, philosophy, art, and science, have long been marvels to those who know him best."

Of his work as editor of the "Labour Leader" Hardie said "Bruce Glasier as editor has had no peer." For a time, Glasier was also Editor of the "Socialist Review". He was author of "The Meaning of Socialism", "William Morris and the the Early Days of the Socialist Movement", and many pamphlets.

From 1911 to 1913 he was Editor of the "Socialist Year Book". He was also very much an International Socialist and he attended many of the International Congresses.

He did contest the Bordesley, Birmingham seat in 1896. However, although he was proposed for various constituencies on innumerable occasions, Glasier preferred to stand aside for others in order to sustain the every day propaganda effort of the movement.

Katherine Bruce Glasier (1867-1950)

Katherine Bruce Glasier was one of the most remarkable women of her age. With Margaret McMillan she was influential in the creation of the Nursery School Movement. She was a passionate advocate, on behalf of the miners, of pit head baths. Above all she devoted her life, in the true spirit of the Society of Friends, to which she belonged, to the cause of world peace. She was one of the creators of the Save the Children Fund.

As Katherine St. John Conway, she was one of the first women graduates of Newnham College, Cambridge. She married John Bruce Glasier and together they made a tremendous contribution to the Labour movement in Britain.

Katherine Bruce Glasier on the platform was a superb speaker. When her husband became ill, she took over the editorship of the "Labour Leader", and through its pages she made a lasting impression upon the thought and philosophy underlying British socialism.

Francis Johnson (1878- 1970)

Francis Johnson joined the I.L.P. in 1896 and became its Secretary in the second half of 1903. He continued in this position until 1924 when the great increase in the activities of the Movement made it necessary to re-organise the Head Office of

the I.L.P.. Under this re-organisation A. Fenner Brockway became General Secretary, and Francis Johnson became Financial Secretary.

Francis Johnson had held the position of General Secretary for 21 years. A special presentation was made to him at the 32nd Annual Conference in 1924 by Fred Jowett.

Jowett warmly praised Francis Johnson for such dedicated service. Francis Johnson had seen the Party grow from less than 7,000 members to 70,000 members.

"I have been his Chairman and his colleague on the N.A.C. for four years," said Fred Jowett, "and he has always been the same loyal worker."

The presentation took the form of a cheque for £100, a medal to decorate him, and a magnificent book containing about 1,000 signatures of famous men in the Movement, both in this country and abroad.

The Conference expressed its great appreciation of Francis Johnson's services by loud and continued applause.

Bernard Shaw criticising their first secretary, Shaw Maxwell, declared that the only thing really wrong with him was "that there was too much Maxwell and too little Shaw in his composition". Of Francis Johnson he said that he was as rare as old Ben, and as correct as Dr. Sam without his ponderosities".

Francis Johnson, in replying, said that it was a very embarrassing moment for him. He was proud to think that he had worked under every Chairman of the I.L.P.. When he entered the Head Office in 1900, as an assistant secretary, he had, like many branch secretaries, very little knowledge of the actual administrative work of the Head Office. However, he adapted to the requirements of the position of General Secretary with great efficiency. He was the power behind the scenes in the I.L.P.. He made other men into great men, but was himself, modest and not especially great.

In the 12th Annual Conference Report of 1904 the section on Secretaryship states:

"We report with pleasure that Mr. Johnson has given the highest satisfaction by the way in which he has discharged his duties. The work of the office this year has been greater than ever before, but it has been done with most commendable efficiency. The Literature department has greatly increased its sales, and Mr. Johnson has handled this department with marked ability."

"We recommend, as a matter of good practice, that the appointment of the Secretary - who as a salaried official has to perform his duties under the instructions of the N.A.C. - should be appointed by the N.A.C. and retained in office so long as his services are satisfactory."

Francis Johnson served for 21 years - he was for more than "satisfactory".

As secretary he had no vote on the N.A.C.. He was responsible for administration, clerical work and the daily running of Head Office and the Publications Department.

After 1924 Francis Johnson served as Financial Secretary of the I.L.P. until his retirement from official party duties in 1944.

Francis Johnson retired from party duties in 1944 on account of ill health and his desire to take a little rest after a long lifetime of service as a Party member and permanent official.

He had served the party faithfully for 44 years.

His last big job of work for the I.L.P. was the Jubilee Fund which through his efforts realised the magnificent sum of £3000. He also produced the Jubilee Souvenir to mark the Jubilee Conference of 1943.

He retired to devote time to historical and literary research into the early years of I.L.P. and British Socialism.

Throughout his long period of service he had also helped the I.L.P. in many other capacities. He did lots of work for the New Leader as an assistant to the various editors. He was also an influential figure in the National Labour Press and from 1940 played a significant role on the Party Literature, Finance and Organisation Committees. He was also Honorary Secretary of the James Maxton Memorial Fund Committee.

Despite his retirement from official duties he was again briefly secretary of the Literature Committee in the 1950s.

Francis Johnson died on October 26, 1970.

F.W. Jowett (1864-1944)

Frederick William Jowett was born in Bradford in 1864. From an early age he worked in a textile mill and later became a Manufacturer's Manager. From 1892 to 1907 he was a member of the Bradford Town Council. In 1900 he unsuccessfully contested West Bradford, but in 1906 he was elected as M.P. and sat for West

Bradford until 1918 when he unsuccessfully contested East Bradford. Four years later he was elected M.P. for East Bradford, but lost this seat in 1924, being re-elected in 1929. In 1931 he stood as an I.L.P. candidate and lost, and in 1935 he was again defeated when he was opposed by the official Labour Party candidate.

Jowett was twice Chairman of the I.L.P. (from 1909 to 1910 and from 1914 to 1917). He was also Chairman of the National Executive of the Labour Party from 1921 to 1922. In 1924 he was appointed First Commissioner of Works. For seventeen years, from 1927 until his death in 1944 he was National Treasurer of the I.L.P.

For a long time he was a member of the Bradford and District Power Loom Overlookers' Society, continuing long after he had ceased to work as a weaving overlooker. He fought hard for improved educational facilities and the provision of schoolmeals, and for a better range of health services. To both his working-class principles and the trade union movement he gave a conscientious, unflagging and widely respected allegiance.

J. Ramsay MacDonald (1866-1941)

Born in a small Scottish fishing village he was educated at Drainie Board School and then became a journalist. He joined the I.L.P. in 1894 and proved himself to be a first-rate organiser. After unsuccessfully contesting Southampton in 1895 and Leicester in 1900, he was elected M.P. for Leicester in 1906. Fired by a powerful ambition for socialist reforms he was Chairman of the I.L.P. from 1906 to 1909.

However, Ramsay MacDonald had already helped to found the Labour Representation Committee, the forerunner of the official Labour Party, and was Secretary from 1900 to 1906, continuing to 1912 as Secretary of the Labour Party. From 1911 to 1914 he led the Parliamentary Labour Party.

He lost influence during the war because of his pacifist views and involvement with the Union of Democratic Control and was defeated in the 1918 election.

Four years later he was re-elected at Aberavon and promptly restored as leader of the Parliamentary Labour Party, largely through Scottish support. As Labour had 25 more seats than the Liberals MacDonald became Leader of the Opposition.

In 1924 he headed the short-lived Labour minority government and in 1929 once again returned to power. Unfortunately, the worsening financial situation precipitated the fall of his government and in August 1931 he formed a coalition National

Government which the majority of the Labour Party refused to support. He led the coalition for four years but was a mere figurehead for a predominantly Conservative administration. He resigned in June 1935 and was succeeded by Baldwin.

As Prime Minister until 1935, MacDonald exercised considerable influence in foreign affairs but continued to be regarded as a traitor by his former I.L.P. and Labour colleagues. He resigned from the I.L.P. in 1930. However, before the First World War he had made a significant contribution to the success of the I.L.P. and exerted considerable influence as Editor of the "Socialist Review".

Philip Snowden (1864-1937)

He joined the I.L.P. in 1895 and became a member of the National Council in 1898. From 1903 to 1906 and from 1917 to 1920 he was Chairman of the I.L.P. From 1920 to 1922 he was also National Treasurer. He contested Blackburn as the I.L.P. candidate in 1900 and was M.P. for Blackburn from 1906 to 1918. He was elected as M.P. for Colne Valley in 1922. Later he served as Chancellor of the Exchequer in the first and second Labour Governments. Snowden resigned from the I.L.P. in 1927.

James Maxton (1885-1946)

A teacher in Glasgow and an enthusiastic member of the Class Teachers' Association and the Educational Institute of Scotland, James Maxton fought for better conditions for teachers and their children. Discussions with fellow socialist teachers, John McLean and L. McNeil Weir, led him to join the I.L.P. in 1906. He first became Literature Secretary, then Branch Secretary of the Barrhead Branch, and soon became Secretary of the Renfrewshire Federation and Chairman of the Scottish I.L.P. Council. In 1912 he was elected to the National Council of the I.L.P.

During the war he took a firm stance as a conscientious objector and was then arrested for his support of Scottish engineers at Glasgow Green. He was sentenced to 12 months imprisonment for sedition. During this time he met Sissie McCallum whom he married later. Her early tragic death greatly influenced his future life and political activity.

Released from prison he became a shipyard labourer and made many friends and contacts. After the war he became Scottish Organiser of the I.L.P. and under his direction the Party became the most important political organisation in Scotland.

In 1914 Montrose Burghs invited him to become their Parliamentary Candidate but in 1916 relinquished their claim in favour of Bridgeton.

He was unsuccessful in the 1918 election but by 1922 unemployment was rife in Clydeside. He was elected as M.P. for Bridgeton with a large majority of 7,698. He staunchly stood up for the rights of the workers of Clydeside for better social conditions.

From 1925 onwards James Maxton became the acknowledged leader of the forces of the left in the Labour Party. He was elected Chairman of the I.L.P. (1926-1931) and again (1934-1939). No other person has held this post for so long.

James Maxton stood for bold measures of socialisation based on workers' control as a means of effecting the rapid transformation of Capitalism into Socialism. This was promulgated by the I.L.P. in its "Socialism in our Time" policy of 1925 onwards.

Maxton stood by the workers throughout the General Strike of 1926 and put together the Cook-Maxton Manifesto to the workers of Great Britain. This set forth the basic principles of Independent Labour representation laid down by Keir Hardie and re-affirmed the Struggle for Socialism.

The decisive break between the Labour Party and the I.L.P. came in 1932. Maxton and his colleagues placed their allegiance to Socialism before the acceptance of Parliamentary expedients.

Maxton's second marriage to Madeleine Glasier took place in 1935.

Maxton was, above all, an International Socialist. He was always in close touch with Continental comrades and made a significant impact at the 1931 Vienna Congress of the Socialist International. He called upon German workers to close ranks to defeat the rise of National Socialism under Hitler.

In two books, "If I were a Dictator" and "The Life of Lenin", Maxton clearly expresses his devotion to liberty and democracy. He fought against all forms of totalitarianism. He went to Spain in 1937 and was instrumental in saving a large number of Spanish socialists. He and his parliamentary colleagues sent a special letter to Stalin in 1938 urging an end to the persecution of fellow socialists in Russia. Maxton was also largely responsible for saving from torture and death hundreds of trade unionists in Austria and Czechoslovakia. He renounced war as a method of freeing the world from brutality and cruelty. During this period his views expressed the sentiments of many of his fellow countrymen. His attitude during the Munich Crisis has been severely criticised. However, it was perfectly in keeping with his social and political philosophy. He welcomed the "breathing space which has been vouchsafed for us." He said that workers

throughout the world should unite in the time gained to avert any recourse to war.

Maxton led the opposition to conscription in 1939. However, his pacifist stance led to isolation throughout the war years. He was elected for Bridgeton in 1945 for the last time. By now he was beset by serious ill health and he died a year later.

A. Fenner Brockway (1888-1988)

A journalist by profession, Fenner Brockway was imprisoned as a conscientious objector during the First World War. In 1917 he became Secretary of the No Conscription Fellowship. He was an active member of the I.L.P. as Editor of "Labour Leader" 1912-1917, and of "New Leader" between 1926-1929 and 1931-1946. He became Organising and Political Secretary of the I.L.P. in 1923 and was Chairman of the I.L.P. from 1931 to 1934.

He unsuccessfully contested Lancaster in 1922 and Westminster at the by-election in March 1924. He was M.P. for the East Leyton division from 1929 to 1931. He fought, as an I.L.P. candidate, East Leyton in 1931, the Upton division of West Ham in May 1934, Norwich in 1935, Lancaster in October 1941 and East Cardiff in April 1942, but all without success.

He rejoined the Labour Party in 1946. He was elected for Eton and Slough in 1950 and sat until 1964 when he was defeated. He became Chairman of the Congress of Peoples against Imperialism in 1948; Chairman of the Movement for Colonial Freedom in 1954; Chairman of the British Asian and Overseas Socialist Fellowship in 1959; Chairman of the Peace in Nigeria Committee in 1967; and Chairman of the British Council for Peace in Vietnam in 1965. In 1964 he was given a Life Peerage.

- 1856 Keir Hardie born in Lanarkshire.

- 1895 I.L.P. fields 28 candidates who together with 4 SDF candidates polled 44,000 votes but did not succeed in electing a single M.P. Keir Hardie lost his seat at West Ham.
- 1900 I.L.P. becomes one of the affiliated organisations in the Labour Representation Committee. Ramsay MacDonald, the I.L.P. nominee, secures the secretaryship of the L.R.C. Keir Hardie re-elected as M.P. at a by-election at Merthyr-Tydfil.
- 1901 Taff Vale judgement.
- 1906 10 I.L.P. sponsored candidates fought General Election campaign in January alongside other L.R.C. candidates. Hardie, MacDonald, Snowden and 4 others were successful.
- 1907 Victor Grayson wins Colne Valley By-Election.
- 1909 Osborne judgement.
Resignation of Hardie, MacDonald, Snowden and Bruce Glasier from the I.L.P. National Administrative Council.

Lloyd George pressures Liberal Party into taking initiative on social reform. Lloyd George budget of 1909 proposed a number of controversial reforms. F.W. Jowett becomes Chairman of the I.L.P.

- 1910 Four new members of the I.L.P. Council publish a pamphlet entitled "Let Us Reform the Labour Party". Known as the "Green Manifesto" because of the colour of its cover, this document fiercely criticised the leadership for abandoning the original position of the I.L.P. which stated that "Labour must fight for Socialism and its own hand against BOTH the Capitalist parties IMPARTIALLY"
Internal dissension continues within the I.L.P. but rebels led by Grayson failed to win control of the party.
- 1911 Creation of the British Socialist Party (B.S.P.) with significant S.D.F. element under leadership of H.M. Hyndman.
By 1911 the assault of the discontented Socialists upon the alliance of the I.L.P. with the trade unionists had, however, been narrowly defeated.
- 1914 I.L.P. totally opposed to the war. MacDonald resigns from the leadership of the Parliamentary Labour Party and he and his I.L.P. colleagues found themselves fighting a lonely battle against the war with the help of a small minority of Liberals.
MacDonald joined with Norman Angell, E.D. Morel, Charles Trevelyan, and Arthur Ponsonby, to form the Union of Democratic Control in September 1914. The UDC campaigned on a total anti-war stance.
F.W. Jowett once again became Chairman of the I.L.P.
- 1915 Death of Keir Hardie.
- 1916 Lloyd George coalition government invites several members of Labour Party to fill government posts.
- 1918 Revision of the Labour Party Constitution.
- 1922 New I.L.P. Constitution adopted.
Labour Party wins 142 seats in the General Election. Of these, 32 were won by I.L.P. sponsored candidates.
- 1924 MacDonald forms a minority Labour government. The I.L.P. sponsored M.P.s numbered 39. The new I.L.P. Left was represented in the Cabinet by John Wheatley, who became Minister of Health, whilst F.W. Jowett, of the older generation, became First Commissioner of Works.

- 1926 General Strike.
- 1927 The I.L.P. new statement of policy "Socialism in Our Time" put together with the advice of J.A. Hobson was rejected by the Labour Party. At the 1927 Labour Party Conference both MacDonal and Snowden and many trade-union leaders opposed the new I.L.P. statement on policy.
- 1928 The Labour Party adopted a rather vague policy statement entitled "Labour and the Nation". From this point, the rift between I.L.P. policy and Labour Party policy significantly widened. The struggle continued about whether I.L.P. sponsored M.P.s should support the policy of the I.L.P. or that of the Labour Party.
- 1929 37 I.L.P. Members were elected amongst the 288 Labour M.P.s returned to Parliament in 1929. These I.L.P. Members proved to be some of the second Labour Government's strongest critics.
- 1930 At the I.L.P. Conference it was agreed that I.L.P. Members would vote against the Labour Government when its actions conflicted with I.L.P. policy.
- 1932 I.L.P. was disaffiliated by the Labour Party Conference.
- 1935 17 I.L.P. candidates stand against Official Labour Party candidates and 4 I.L.P. candidates are successful in Glasgow.
- 1945 In the post-war General Election 3 I.L.P. candidates were successful.
- 1946 Death of I.L.P. party leader, James Maxton. Since the election of a single member in 1946, no I.L.P. candidates have successfully attained seats in Parliament. The I.L.P. documents for the period 1940-1975 advocate socialism as the only basis for a true democracy. Policy statements are brief and emphasize the party's desire to "end the division of an owning class and a working class" and to establish a "classless society".
- 1948 I.L.P. Conference puts forward proposals for a programme of Socialist reconstruction.
- 1950 I.L.P. autumn campaign for a world socialist commonwealth. Publication of two significant I.L.P. pamphlets, one entitled "The Road to Socialism" and the other "A Socialist Plan for Peace".
Death of Katherine Bruce Glasier.

- 1953 Diamond jubilee conference of the I.L.P. held at Bradford, April 1953.
- 1955 I.L.P. campaign against the Hydrogen Bomb.
- 1961 I.L.P. continues to protest about a Polaris missile submarine base in the Clyde estuary and reaffirms its policy of Unilateral Nuclear Disarmament.
I.L.P. criticises the Government's Pension Scheme.
- 1967 Evidence submitted by the I.L.P. to the Royal Commission on Trade Unions.
- 1968 I.L.P. Conference passes resolutions calling for the withdrawal of American troops and an end to the war in Vietnam.
- 1970 I.L.P. pamphlet "In place of strife - means in place of trade unions" produced.
- 1971 I.L.P. continues its campaign against the Common Market. Publication of pamphlet entitled "Britain and the Common Market: A Socialist Spotlight on the 'European Community'".
- 1975 I.L.P. attacks the failures of the Labour Party and, in particular, the Pay Freeze.

BRIEF NOTE ON PAMPHLETS AND LEAFLETS, PARTS 1-5 (1893-1975)

This collection of pamphlets and leaflets traces the development of Labour thought from the foundation of the I.L.P. in 1893 by J. Keir Hardie, John Trevor and Robert Blatchford through to modern times. It covers the central political and social issues of the period: unemployment, trade unions, strike action, labour law, commercialism and child labour, education, poverty, women's suffrage, Parliamentary representation, war, conscription, disarmament, and the nature, policies and aims of a "Labour" party.

It is divided into five parts as follows:-

- Part 4: 1925-1939

Author indexes and chronological listings appear on the first fiche of each part.

Also available from Research Publications under the title of Socialist and Labour Thought in Britain Since 1884 is a unique collection of pamphlets from the I.L.P. library which encompasses the very wide range of socialist and reform groups in Britain from the turn of the nineteenth century to the end of the Second World War.

A NOTE ON THE MATERIAL

The private minute books of the National Administrative Council of the Independent Labour Party constitute a vital source for critical analysis of the I.L.P. and of the growth of British socialism from the 1890s. They provide a wealth of research material for the historian or student of British politics, and offer insights into more than 50 years of socialist activity and thought. This microfiche collection contains all the surviving NAC Minute Books in the I.L.P. Archive.

Hitherto unavailable to scholars, the minutes provide a unique and comprehensive picture of the I.L.P. at work. By the mid 1920s, with some 700 branches and 60,000 members, the party was the intellectual power-house of British social thought and an active influence on international affairs. The leadership of the I.L.P. provided the major figures of British socialism in the first 40 years of the century: these materials highlight the work of Keir Hardie, Philip Snowden, F.W. Jowett, Tom Mann, Ramsay MacDonald, Bruce Glasier, James Maxton and J.R. Clynes. The collection illustrates the party's discussions with the Social Democratic Federation, the trade union movement, the Fabian Society, the Labour Party, and records the efforts of the I.L.P. to liaise with socialists in other countries in an attempt to achieve a united socialism.

In addition to the NAC Minute Books this collection also includes a number of important supporting documents such as General Account Books, Minutes of the Parliamentary Committee, Minutes of the Organising Committee, Minutes of the Joint Committee of the I.L.P. and Fabian Society, National Office Circulars, Minutes and Bulletins of the International Bureau for Revolutionary Socialist Unity and other related records.

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A NOTE ON THE MATERIAL

This second part includes all the Branch Minutes and Papers which were deposited at head office and are part of the I.L.P. Archives. This is not a complete collection of surviving Branch material because many of the records of the various branches found their way into local record offices. Please see page 261 of this guide for notes on other sources.

However, this microfiche edition does bring together a significant number of records to enable the study of the I.L.P. at a regional and local level.

There are particularly full and detailed minute books for Bilston, Birmingham, Chingford, Ilford, London, Norwich, Shettleton, West Bromwich and Woolwich.

There are records for Bradford for 1901 to 1912, but little for Glasgow or anywhere else in Scotland. Please see details of Scottish Regional Records in Sources in British Political History 1900-1951: Volume 1 compiled by Chris Cook (MacMillan 1975).

In addition there are financial statements, accounts, cash books, membership records and rule books for these and other branches.

A NOTE ON THE MATERIAL

This microform publication contains the Francis Johnson Correspondence and marks a major event in labour publishing. The collection ranges over the whole period of I.L.P. and Keir Hardie activity from 1888 to 1950. It is probably the most important single archive on this period of British Labour politics.

Part One of the Francis Johnson Correspondence covers the years 1888 to 1908. Part Two covers the years 1909 to 1950. They provide the labour historian and political scientist with a substantial new reservoir of material and represents probably the most interesting corpus of material opened for research in recent years. Beginning with the celebrated and controversial mid-Lanark by-election of 1888, when Keir Hardie stood as an Independent Labour candidate against the official Liberal, the documents offer new insights into the revival and development of socialism in England. By 1909 the I.L.P. was indisputably a major force in British politics, and a major Parliamentary force as well. The collection illuminates this period of influence and offers fresh evidence on the inter-war debate and the fortunes of the Party after the Second World War.

Francis Johnson was the I.L.P.'s corresponding secretary for nearly half a century. Among the correspondents are such major radical leaders as Keir Hardie, Ramsay MacDonald, Philip Snowden, Edward Carpenter, George Lansbury, W.C. Anderson, J.R. Clynes, A.R. Orage, Wilfrid Scawen Blunt, Norman Angell, H.M. Hyndman, Beatrice Webb, Arthur Henderson and Sylvia Pankhurst. The richness of this correspondence cannot be overstated. It is the most important event in labour publishing over the last twenty years. The wealth of new research material, never previously available, makes this a crucial source for historians.

The complete listing

The complete listing of the documents in Part One appears on Reel 1 and the complete listing of Part Two appears on Reel 10. The relevant section of the listings is reproduced at the beginning of each reel. This listing contains the date of each letter, the names of the correspondents, and the principle subject matter. Only the initials of the main correspondents are given. The town

from which the letter had been sent is given in brackets at the end of the first line of each entry. Should the document concern the affairs of any particular branch this is shown by the name of the branch given in capital letters, in the second or third line. The abbreviation R.P.B. refers to routine party business.

It has proved necessary to rework and retype the listing which was prepared with the aid of an SSRC grant. When the material was examined closely not only was it found that some items were missing but that there were a number of documents in the files which had not been listed. A number of documents had also been filed completely out of order. In many cases the wrong date or information had been given on the original listing and this has now been corrected. However, as scholars have referred to the SSRC listing - a copy of which is in the British Library of Political and Economic Science in London - we have retained the original SSRC numbering of the documents and where necessary have amended with cross-references, extra "A" entries, and notes.

To enable users of the original listing to know when changes have been made we have added "Incorrectly listed in SSRC listing" in brackets at the end of the entry. When a document was incorrectly dated in the original listing it has been moved to its correct position and a note against the original entry number details this.

The original listing did not give the number of pages of each item. During the reworking we decided to add this extra bibliographical information. A word of explanation is required as Part One and Part Two were numbered on a different basis. Some documents had additional pencilled notes - sometimes in shorthand. As there was no indication when these additional notes had been made they were considered to be of possible interest and included in the page count of Part One. Unfortunately some were in such faint pencil that it proved impossible to reproduce them. This has resulted in the occasional discrepancy between the number of pages given in the listing and the number of pages which appear on film. All these cases have been carefully checked to ensure all documents have been filmed in their entirety. In the few cases when an original letter is incomplete this has been noted in the listing. In Part Two we have only given the page numbers of the original letters.

The deficiencies in the original listing, useful though it was, and the errors in the order of the documents inevitably delayed the publication of the Correspondence. Each document had to be carefully checked, new entries made (in some cases there was no original listing for whole sections), and a new 833 page listing had to be typed. Our thanks must go to Lorraine Langridge for her patience and care in the preparation of this work.

The index

It has not been possible to reproduce the 833 page listing in hard-copy but we hope the Index reproduced here will show the wide range of the collection. A complete review of the listing will reveal its full richness. It must be stressed that this is only a selective index and does not include the letters by and to Francis Johnson as his position within the I.L.P. entailed his being a constant correspondent.

Each document has been numbered in pencil on the first page. This Index will allow rapid access to the letters sent and received by the principal correspondents. The year has been underlined followed by the document number within that year. The List of Contents of each reel shows which years have been reproduced on which reel. The reader will be able to select that reel and either refer to the listing which appears at the beginning of the reel or wind direct to the document itself.

Condition of original material

Attention should be drawn to the nature of the original material. Many of the documents have been written in a variety of inks and pencils and in different handwriting and occasionally these have suffered from ink-fade, heavy staining and show-through. The original paper is often a variety of colours - blue, pink, yellow, green and grey. Sometimes letters had been badly handled and the occasional word is missing, telegrams may be obscure, newspaper cuttings tend to be worn, and in some cases photocopies had to be made. There are also documents which are extremely difficult to read in the original. Poor carbon copies were a particular problem. These characteristics did present difficulties of image and contrast which stringent tests and camera alterations could not entirely overcome. Conscious of the problems we sought to exercise responsible care in the production of this unique collection and to meet the standards established by the National Microform Association (NMA) and the American National Standards Institute (ANSI).

Acknowledgements

We would like to take this opportunity to extend our thanks for the generosity and far-sightedness of the National Administrative Council of the I.L.P.. Without their determination that the Archives should be made available for all scholars the papers might still be ensconced in hiding with their future uncertain. In particular everyone must thank Don Bateman, and his wife Edith, for having placed part of their house at the disposal of the Archives for so many years, and also for having agreed to the

SSRC supported researcher using a room as an office and having free access to their home for three years. We must also thank them for so patiently and cheerfully suffering the large amount of inconvenience and misunderstanding caused by a contrary claim to the ownership of the papers. Anyone with any interest in labour history must be grateful, not only to Don and Edith Bateman, but also to Barry Winter and all members of the I.L.P. National Administrative Council for so generously donating the collection to a major University Library so that they should be available for scholarship. To ensure the widest possible availability this microform edition was prepared before the papers were deposited at the British Library of Political and Economic Science, London.

A NOTE ON THE MATERIAL

The microfilm edition of the Organisational and Regional Records completes the major series of the collections from the Archives of the Independent Labour Party.

This brings together important sections of new, never previously published material. This includes papers of individuals, central organisation papers, journals and circulars, parliamentary election addresses, and grass-roots campaigning and election papers.

The Parliamentary Election Addresses provide important material for over 200 constituencies ranging from Keir Hardie's celebrated Mid-Lanark by-election of 1888 to the numerous electoral attempts of Philip Snowden, John Bruce Glasier, Clement Attlee, and other ILP candidates. These show the ways in which the ILP appealed to the electorate and the relative sophistication of the party machine.

Papers concerning Municipal, Urban District, Rural District, Parish Council, School Board and Board of Guardians elections illustrate in detail grass-roots campaigning and demonstrate the will of the ILP to become a truly pervasive national influence, building up from local politics to national issues.

A representative selection of local ILP and related journals, with titles as diverse as ILP News, 1897-1903; Forces Bulletin, 1944-1945; The Labour Elector, 1888-1893; Bradford ILP News, 1932-1943; The Free Man (Leicester), 1901-1911; and The Worker (Fife), 1898-1900, provide a marvellous resource for the understanding of the British working-class and the modern British Labour movement at the regional level. Most of these journals were filed by the ILP for reference purposes and now exist nowhere else.

There is also an extremely important section of manuscript papers relating to Keir Hardie, John Bruce Glasier, Alf Mattison, Francis Johnson and F.W. Jowett.

The Hardie papers include original manuscript notes for speeches and articles by Hardie on subjects such as "Pigs and Politics", "Bemoaning the Lack of effort on behalf of the poor" and "Asquith, a political mercenary".

ARCHIVES OF THE INDEPENDENT LABOUR PARTY

The Bruce Glasier files include his own handwritten notebooks on "The Commune of Paris" and "Anarchism", as well as many speeches, some correspondence, poetry and ephemera.

Alf Mattison is represented by "some random reminiscences on the very early years of the Socialist Movement, 1885-1895" - an important piece of testimony for Labour History. There are also some of his lecture notes and a small amount of correspondence.

The Francis Johnson section includes many key letters by leading figures that look to have been removed by him from the main correspondence sequence (already published) as an autograph collection. Clifford Allen, Edward Carpenter, James Maxton, James Ramsay MacDonald and Edward Pease are but a few of the correspondents included.

Finally, the F.W. Jowett section comprises a considerable body of his constituency business as a long-serving ILP member for Bradford, as well as notes for speeches, records of elections and notes of parliamentary questions.

The Central Organisation Papers include draft constitutions, directories of regional branches, manifestoes, historical literature, press cuttings, Annual Conference Papers, international correspondence and papers, papers on relations with the Communist International, and ILP Political Committee Papers on Germany and Italy.

Taken together these papers are an extremely valuable source for all Labour historians. Gems such as the manuscript notebooks of Hardie and Bruce Glasier are supplemented by a wealth of electioneering and central party organisation records documenting the rise of the ILP.

This project includes a detailed 145 page listing of all five sections of this new publication.
