INTRODUCTION

This collection which has been microfilmed is a clipping archive. For the past six years we have gathered clippings from newspapers, newsletters, speeches, flyers, research papers, etc. nationwide documenting primarily the current women's rights movement. Our "staff" doing this gathering has been almost totally women from communities and cities all over the country volunteering their time and energy. Thus the nature of the clipping/gathering has been sporadic and random at times. Due to the location of the Women's History Research Center, Inc. here in Berkeley the most complete and consistent gathering has been from California sources. Nonetheless, there is no other clipping archive on the topic of Women and the Law as complete and extensive as that which we have microfilmed.

This microfilm collection is extremely valuable for large academic libraries who wish to provide comprehensive primary source research material on this topic (as evidenced by the fact that our complete clipping archive, of which Women and Law is but one quarter, has been acquired and is now being housed at the University of Wyoming's Archive of Contemporary History).

This collection is also extremely valuable to public libraries and public school libraries as it allows the public who are not members of the legal or academic communities exposure and access to information on Women and the Law which is otherwise not readily available or comprehensible to those outside the legal arena. Alameda County Library considered WOMEN AND LAW so vital to public and high school library users that it applied for an Alameda County Revenue Sharing Grant which we have used to microfilm and distribute these films.

This collection will of course have specific value to lawyers, law students, legal workers and law libraries as "women's law" has only begun developing and being explored. Thus in the legal field where only a few texts exist on this topic our collection is invaluable in terms of research and education.

The material included in this microfilm collection has been grouped by subject. The subject headings are both broad (e.g. "Legal Centers") and specific (e.g. "ACLU Women's Rights Project"). There is, therefore, usually an overlap between "files" (i.e. subject groups). Our experience has shown us that the topic of women does not fall into the prescribed Library of Congress classification system, and over the years we have developed our own system of classification in conjunction with the traditional. A description and explanation of our classification system is included in this Reel Guide.

A unique element of our classification system is that materials in a file on a specific subject cover the full range of opinions and ideas and thus show many sides to that subject. We did not make a judgment as to the importance of an item but have rather left that decision to you, the researcher, using this microfilm collection.

In microfilming such a vast collection of this type of material there have been technical difficulties which we have attempted to overcome. One such problem was the Table of Contents at the beginning of each reel. There was no way of determining exactly which files would be on each reel *prior* to actual filming. Therefore, we have filmed the entire Table of Contents of each Section at the front of each reel that makes up that Section. Following this complete Table of Contents is the title of the specific file to be filmed and then the contents of the file itself.

For locating a specific file (i.e. subject) this Reel Guide should be used, as both the reel number and image location are indicated herein.

Another problem has been citations of each article. Due to the nature of the clippings and the "staff", some material was not cited fully and some not cited at all. But perhaps the most glaring problem of citation arises out of the nature of the material itself. Newspaper, loose sheets of paper, etc. does not have a long "life expectancy", especially when it is handled constantly by thousands of people over several years. Thus, some of the citations have been blurred with age or have been destroyed from handling (and therefore the need for microfilming!). Most of the citations have, however, been preserved. For those articles which we

could not find the citations, which included researching them, we have filmed these articles together at the end of each file noting that "date and/or source unknown". We felt it was far more important to include the material at the end of the file rather than leaving it out of the collection entirely due to lack of citation.

Our greatest problem has been that of indexing. It would take a large staff of librarians many years to index this collection by author or periodical for each article/piece of information. What is more, most microfilm publishers and purchasers have been stunned by our tremendous success in sales of our Herstory Women's Serials microfilms which have not even a subject index as this **WOMEN AND LAW** collection has. It has taken us three years to obtain sufficient funding to microfilm the **WOMEN AND LAW** subject files herein. We felt that getting the collection preserved on microfilm was top priority as actual deterioration of these clippings is a realistic danger. We have therefore had to suffice by indexing the materials by subject (i.e. file) headings.

The people responsible for building this collection over the last six years and those people who have worked on getting this collection microfilmed are enthusiastic about the public's response and acceptance. We hope that you will let us know your comments, suggestions and criticisms -- and most importantly, we hope that you will share in our enthusiasm!

**FILE CLASSIFICATION SYSTEM
OF THE
WOMEN'S HISTORY RESEARCH CENTER, INC.**

The *File Classification Number* is found in parentheses directly after the *File Title* in both the Table of Contents and the Alphabetical Index. It does not refer to the file's position on the microfilm; rather, it is part of the system invented by the librarians at the Women's History Research Center, Inc. for their collection of the Topical File Archive.

The "letter" component of the *File Classification Number* is the most telling: This letter reveals the broad category of information which will be found in the file, e.g. all "H" files contain material about individual women, all "J" files about women's liberation groups, etc. The "number" following the letter is an arbitrary one, being assigned chronologically as each new file was started. There are approximately 2,000 files in this system.

The following is a brief explanation of the **File Classifications A - R**:

A: WOMEN IN COUNTRIES. Contains information on women in various foreign countries and in ethnic groups within the United States. Material is gathered from around the world and is of both contemporary and historical origin. The category has general information on the changing roles and social conditions of women throughout the world, authored by men and women. If an individual woman, now deceased, is known by name, she will probably have a file in "B" (Women in History). Information about a particular historical movement involving women from a country other than the United States will also be found in "B". If the women in a particular country have an active women's liberation movement, material will be found in "J" (Women's Liberation Groups). Material is in the form of flyers, pamphlets, graphics, magazine and newspaper clippings, original research papers.

B: WOMEN IN HISTORY. Contains information on individual women (deceased) and women in historical movements. (Women still living are listed in "H".) Given the dearth of available information on women and women's role in history, this category was created in order to record new material and gather existing material on individual women in history. Mass media and original papers by or about these women; also reviews and research papers.

C: MEN AND WOMEN'S LIBERATION. Contains information concerning men as they have related and reacted to women and women's movements. The material is contemporary as well as historical. Articles from mass media; research papers.

D: NON-WOMEN'S LIBERATION GROUPS. Material presented in these files is in three basic sub-categories: (1) files on groups and organizations with mixed male and female membership in which there is either a separate women's caucus or some emphasis on women's consciousness; (2) groups with all female membership whose focus is not women's liberation; and (3) organizations whose membership is mixed but women-dominated without any separate consciousness. These are distinct from all women's groups whose focus is women's liberation (this type of material found in "J"). Articles from mass media; leaflets and position papers; letters.

E: PROJECTS AND SERVICES. Included in this category are files on projects created and run by women since the inception of the current women's movement, and services provided by male institutions which meet specific needs of women. Information is current and deals mainly with services available in the United States. Articles from mass media; records of personal experiences; groups' reports.

F: PROTEST AND EVENTS. Contains information from rallies, demonstrations, conferences, etc. which dealt with issues of primary importance to women. Material is principally from the United States and serves as a chronicle of women's actions in the contemporary women's liberation movement. Articles from mass and alternative press; flyers; leaflets, position papers.

G: WOMEN IN ROLES. Contains material on women in their classical, traditional roles, vocations and stereotypes. Information is contemporary and historical. Information is intended to chronicle the oppression of women in economic and psychological terms. Articles clipped from mass and alternative press.

H: SPECIFIC WOMEN. Contains information on women in current history, each of whom has some achievement or characteristic which is of importance to all women – either through her writings, lifestyle, art, politics, or some specific action. The material is about, as well as authored by, the individual woman. Articles from mass and alternative press; reviews, interviews, personal letters and papers.

I: SUBJECTS. Information on specific topics of interest which primarily describes the nature of women's oppression by institutions and laws. Articles from mass and alternative press; original research.

J: WOMEN'S LIBERATION GROUPS. Material presented in these files is from women's liberation groups throughout the United States and various foreign countries. Includes correspondence from individuals, manifestos; pamphlets; posters and announcements of group activities. This collection began as active women's liberation groups began to form worldwide and is indicative of the scope of the current women's liberation movement.

K: WOMEN'S FICTION AND WORKS. Material written by women about women solely. Includes original poetry, songs, art, short fiction, research articles, etc., as well as position papers by Third World and white women.

L: MASS PERIODICALS. Articles on women and the women's movement from the mass media and alternative publications.

M: SPECIAL ISSUES OF MASS PERIODICALS. Special issues of mass and alternative press devoted to women and/or the women's liberation movement; written primarily by women.

***N: WOMEN'S NEWSLETTERS.** Contemporary newsletters published by women's liberation groups in the United States and around the world. They are classified by city, state and national organization.

***O: NEWSPAPERS.** Newspapers written and published entirely by women.

***P: JOURNALS.** A collection of articles and poetry by women for women, compiled in journals whose sole purpose is to provide a place for women to publish materials not deemed "important" enough by established media.

Q: WOMEN'S LIBERATION MOVEMENT. Information dealing with issues and arguments related to the women's liberation movement as a whole (e.g. child care, name change). Also notes new perspectives created by the movement and the attendant new issues which have emerged for women.

R: BIBLIOGRAPHIES AND SYLLABI. Course outlines for women's studies courses and bibliographies of women's works as suggested reading lists for these courses.

*These sections, "N", "O" and "P", now make up our Women's Serials Department which is presently housed at Northwestern University Special Collection's Library.

As an example of how information would be filed, consider the topic of "abortion": Materials will be found in "A: WOMEN IN COUNTRIES" under the file "Bangladesh Women"; in "B: WOMEN IN HISTORY" under the file "Margaret Sanger"; in "C: MEN AND WOMEN'S LIBERATION" under the file "Dr. Hippocrates"; in "E: PROJECTS AND SERVICES" under the file "Planned Parenthood"; in "F: PROTEST AND EVENTS" under the file "Abortion Rallies"; and in "I: SUBJECTS" under the file "Abortion".

Therefore, for every file in "I: SUBJECTS" there are files in the other classification sections for that same subject, but with a more specific approach.

Further Note on Subject Headings: Many of our subject headings, for instance Women as . . . , are blatantly sexist. We want people to know this is deliberate, as the point was to illustrate the general public's sexist views of women. They are the style the Library of Congress was using vintage 1969 when we started them.
